Judicial system in Pakistan is complex and intricate institutions that play vital role in ensuring rule of law and delivering justice. However, there are some lacunas in the justice system of Pakistan that impedes the justice system to work efficiently and effectively. According to <sup>international</sup> Transparency report 2023 the most corrupt institutions in Pakistan are judiciary, police, education and health sector. Hence, corruption in judicial system not only erode public trust but also hamper the delivery of justice. The menace of

corruption is hurdle in justice system. Addition to this another problem which is associated with judicial system is delayed justice. The justice in Pakistan is not only expensive but also delayed.

According to law and justice commission report 2023 2.26 million

cases are pending in court. Another

system. By addressing issues that are (lagging) impeding the rule of law and accountability, can improve the efficiency of judicial system.

### 'Neocolonialism'

Neo-colonialism refers to indirect control over post-colonial region or countries through political, economic and social factors.

Neocolonialism is basically a tactic to exploit the countries for self-interest. Hence, neo-colonialism exploits social, economic and political arenas to maintain the hegemony.

In economic front countries exploit the resources of the country. These countries extract the resources from the country and then sell these products on inflated prices.

In order to have control over state

resources. Multinational firms are established. These not only control the resources but also maintain the hegemony over labour market. Furthermore, through neo-liberal trade policies create injustice and inequality between among states.

These neo-liberal trade policies serve the interests of colonial masters.

These neo-liberal trade policies are either implemented through bilateral trade or through international organization.

In 2000 Pakistan trade barriers

or tariff and non-tariff reduced from 44% to 8% (International Monetary Fund) due World Trade

Organization's policy regarding trade liberalization. Addition to this due to

neo-liberal trade agreements Pakistan's dependency on IPP also increased.

Consequence of this was that

Pakistan strangle into the debt trap.

Another factor which is

being exploited is cultural imperialism. Due to cultural imperialism it creates the illusion that ~~that~~ their culture is superior. The consequence of cultural imperialism is the foreign culture strengthen roots and destroy ~~the~~ culture of the post colonial state. Moreover, Lord Macaulay delivered a speech in Parliament that in 1835 that if you want to control the subcontinent destroy ~~to~~ change their culture. Furthermore, Emile Durkheim stated that no society can grow without education but not without culture. Hence, neocolonialism perpetuate the control through cultural imperialism.

In addition to this it exploits the political culture of the country and promotes the authoritarian regime. It is alarming for the democratic values and threat to the Sovereignty of the State. The reason is that these authoritarian

regime work for the benefits of those colonial forces. Hence, through political culture neocolonialism is maintained.

However, in order to overcome the menace of neocolonialism strong political culture is crucial. Furthermore, economic policies based on the fair principles should be implemented to reduce the dependency. Simmel

P. Lipset presented a model in which he stated, the more well so the nation there is more chances it is going to protect its democracy.

Moreover, preserving culture is also important to bar the neo-colonialism. Hence, it is crucial to maintain the social, political and economic balance to hamper the neo-colonial control.

## Consequences of Rural Migration to Cities

The permanent shifting from rural areas to urban areas depict the migration. According to Rational choice Theory people do cost and benefit analysis and then migrate to urban areas. People move to urban areas due to better employment opportunities (Harris and Todaro Theory) and In addition to this people migrate to cities due to better health facilities, quality education, Technological changes and for availability of services. Hence, the rural migration to cities has its own positive and negative effects. According to USA Bureau of Statistic in 1950 54% world population were residing in Urban areas while in 2000 around 60% of population is residing in Urban areas.

The increase urbanization

demands more houses or residential building, it increase the demand for transportation facilities and also increase the burden on natural resources. Consequences of these things create social, economic, political and environmental challenges. The urban migration cause massive deforestation. According to Global Forest Watch 10 million hectare land have been deforested in past few years. These trees are considered as carbon sinks and due to deforestation it increase the amount of carbon dioxide in the air. According to UN reports CO<sub>2</sub> (carbon dioxide) alone is 60% responsible for the global warming which exacerbates the chances of urban flooding. Furthermore, urban migration increased the industrialization which further harm the environment. Industrialization is becoming the

threat to the natural environment (Silent Spring by Richard Carson). Furthermore, the urban migration impacts the social fabric of the society. According to Social disorganization theory by Mackay and Shaw that too high social mobility cause results in the heterogeneous society which gives rise to the criminal elements in the society. Furthermore, mass urban migration cause the impact on the labour market. Due to excessive supply of employers as compared to the demand of labour affects the wage rate. The labour are being exploited by the employer. In summary, Bourgeoisie the one who controls or owns the resources exploit the proletariats. (Communist Manifesto, Karl Marx). Hence, urbanization brings problem as well. There is no such thing as free lunch (Milton Friedman). However, problems caused by urban

migration can be controlled by few policies implementation. Chief among one is controlling the population. Another one is providing the better health and employment opportunities in rural setup as well. Furthermore, to control urban flooding vertical and climate resistance infrastructure should be encouraged. There must be proper and effective town planning. Hence, through effective measures consequences of urban migration can be mitigated.
