(7) The inspector said to the people, "We have caught the thief and he will be brought to back soon."

The inspector told the people that they had caught the thief and ~~they~~ ^{he} would be brought to back soon.

(8) The lady said to her ~~bro~~ husband, "Whether you agree with me / not I am not going to change my decision."

The lady told her husband ^{that} whether he agrees with her / not, she is not going to change her decision.

⑨ The landlord has said to the young man, "If you do not pay your rent by evening today you will have to leave the house immediately."

The landlord has told to the young man that if he does not pay his rent by evening ~~today~~ ^{that day} then he will have to leave the house immediately.
