It is the foundation upon which a believer's life should be built, guiding them to seek Allah's pleasure and attain eternal success in the Hereafter.

Definition of Religion:

Religion refers to a system of beliefs, practices, rituals and moral values followed by a group of people, typically revolving around the worship of a deity or deities and the interpretation of sacred texts.

Islam is a strictly monotheistic religion, and its adherents called Muslims, regard the prophet Muhammad as the last and most perfect of God's messengers who include

- (i) Adam
- (ii) Abraham
- (iii) Moses
- (iv) Jesus

The sacred scripture of Islam is the Qur'an which contains God's revelations to Muhammad.

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Concept of Deen :

Difference between Deen and Religion

Deen

- Deen is divine and dynamic as well. It is a collective of institutions, social order, practice and beliefs.
- It is far more comprehensive all encompassing reality. It includes the belief, spirituality and etiquet of worship. Salah, Saum, Zakat, Hajj.
- Deen is a collective matter.
- Hence, Islam is essentially a Deen.

Religion

- Religion is a bond between a religious devotee and his God.
- Religion is a term used for a set of beliefs and rituals (religious) for worships.
- It must be understood that while several religions can co-exist.
- A system can either be based on the Law of Allah, or it will be against.
- It provides a complete constitution for the functions of a state.
- Religion is an individual matter.

Role of Deen in Human Life and Society

Deen play a vital role in human life and society. Its message is real and practical because it comprehensively covers all human actions. It explores the **Tauhid doctrine** effectively. It tell us how to live a virtuous life, how to conduct ourselves in public or at home, how to treat Parents, relations, friends, strangers, the Poor or orphans.
