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The author opines, modern education theorists are more concerned about the consequences of granting freedom to children instead of enjoying benefits of their company. If children are subjected to un-conditional affection, they will abruptly follow necessary instructions. However, they will not appreciate the liking for which they have to offer a sacrifice in return. Teachers, having this quality, can effectively deal with them without causing any psychological trauma. But, the over-burdened teachers are less-likely to bear such quality. Therefore, education must be undertaken for about 2 hours by those whose remaining time is spent away from children. Lack of discipline can harm young ones. But if necessary friendliness is preserved, there will be no need to have strict rules in place.
