Pakistan is located at the cross-road of South Asia, central Asia and Middle East. It increases Pakistan's geostrategic and geopolitical importance.

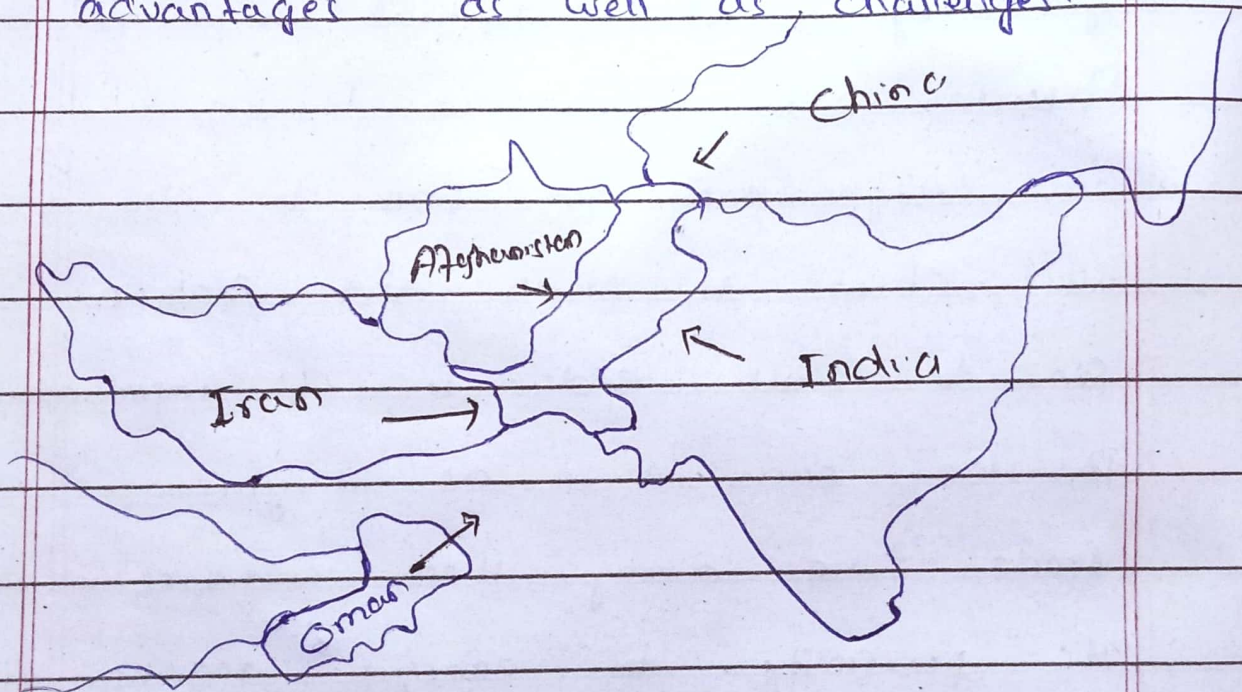
Pakistan's location, India to its east, Afghanistan and Iran to its west, China to North and Arabian Sea to south, adds to its importance.
