What is the difference between Deen and Religion?
Describe the importance of Deen in human life with arguments!

Introduction

According to population education, a website that tracks various demographics regarding population, language, religion and so on

"There are more than 10,000 religions, faith-based practicing groups present in the world."

However, the majority can be split up into four major groups: Christianity (31%), Islam (24%), Hinduism and Buddhism (7%) (15%)

Deen and Religion are used interchangeably to indicate between various groups. In reality, these two words are quite different. Deen is a complete code of life; it encompasses worship, beliefs and is present on the most minute levels. While religion also provides its followers with the beliefs, ritual or worships that they need to live their lives, but it is silent when it comes to the code of life. Both concepts have a similar function but differ in the application. We can say that religion is an individualistic concept while Deen encompasses all.

Concept of Religion

According to Emile Durkheim, religion is one of the most important social institutions of society. Religion is a set of beliefs and worships/rituals that a person follows. In the Arabic language religion is referred to as:

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(ذ.ن.ب) Root word

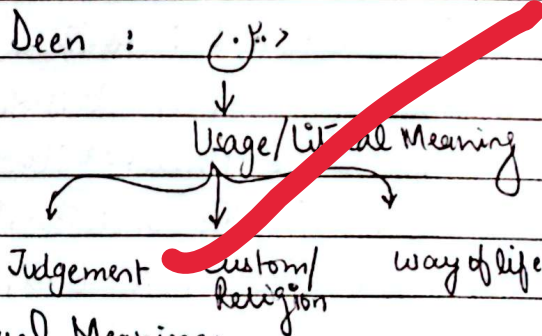
Literal Meanings - Path or road.

Religion is an individualistic concept as it focuses on the self rather than whole society. The scope of religion by doing so, is narrower than the scope of Deen.

Concept of Deen

Deen is an Arabic word. The following is the etymology of the word Deen and usage in Quran :-



Contextual Meaning

Deen is a set of beliefs, worships/rituals that are accompanied by a complete code of life.

Deen is the collective concept of religion. It is a way of life that guides its followers; it is not only a way of life but also brings with it a system of governance comprising of judicial, social, administrative and economic systems.

Difference between Deen and Religion

As we have seen the above discussions, the biggest difference that the two concepts have in between them is: Complete code of life. It is through the code that a society can correct its dealings when it comes to social, political, economic, judicial, administrative issues. Moreover, the individual nature of religion restricts itself from fully realizing its potential. ^{For example,} Any religion in the world, establishes that lying is a sin. However, these religions keep it on the individual to ensure that he doesn't do so. However, Deen raise the ante when it comes to the repercussions. It involves the society and entire collective community. It cautions them from the impacts of a society that isn't truthful and advises for collective action. It forbades lying in every aspect of life.

"Surely this Quran guides to that which is most upright and gives good news to the believers who do good that they shall have a great reward." (Surah Bani-Israel).

Deen Defines The Primary Motive of Life

Deen is the building block of a person's life. It guides and most of all gives meaning to a person's life. Life is not meaningless and rather than living it in a meaningless way. Deen counters that and provides meaning to a person's life. It defines the very reason why a person was created in the first place. As Allah (SWT) says in the Quran:

"We have created the Jinn and Humans for our worship only." (Surah Zariyat).

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Deen Provides a Code of Life:

Deen provides a code of life; this is the primary distinguisher of the two (Deen and Religion). Islam is a complete code of life. It gives divine guidance in all aspects of life. Deen regulates our dealings with others and ourselves. It brings those dealings in accordance with guidelines laid down by the Almighty. Moreover, it also regulates our social interactions and brings them in line with the interactions of as foretold by the Almighty.

Deen Provides a Spiritual Cure for all Times:

Deen provides a meaning and credence to a person's life. There are many times in a person's life when they are in a morally/spiritually depressed. Deen gives moral and spiritual credence to a person's life. It provides a cure for the person's spiritual ailments. Allah (swt) says in the Quran:

"And we reveal of the Quran that - which is a healing and a mercy to the believers and it adds only to the predilection of the unjust."
(Surah-Ankab)

Deen is a source of wisdom & Enlightenment:

For those who require that there be meaning in their lives; Deen provides that. Deen is a source of

wisdom, ^{and} enlightenment for all. It gives meaning to every action that a person does. It also provides a rationale, rhetoric for why a person should do something. It broadens the mind and ^{the} depth of thought. As Allah (SWT) says in the Quran

"Surely, there are signs for the wise."

(Al-Quran)
