Despite all the debates and efforts gender equality could not be acquired due to some factors that are becoming hurdles in the way of gender equality.

Among these hurdles, political representation is the major hurdle. The underrepresentation of women in politics and in parliament remains the most obvious factor in this regard. In Pakistan and all around the globe the women's are not given enough

representation in parliament.

According to a report of UN Women with a title of Women in Politics: 2023,

the representation of women in the parliament is only

26.5% and there are only

31 countries where women

serves as Heads of State

and Government. Even in

Pakistan women make up

just 21% of members of

Parliament and only 12% of

women appointed at ministerial

positions. So all these

figures are the evidences that

women are facing underrepresentation

in politics. With this

much little representation

women have little role

in decision making and


legislation. Furthermore, women are also

victimized and they also

face character assassination.

Recently, we witnessed the issue of a leaked video of a female politician. Moreover, some female politicians were called targeted because of their physical appearance. So all these factors collectively contribute in becoming a hurdle for women representation in politics.

Secondly, economic inequalities are another factor in marginalization of women making gender equality a popular slogan. There is a clear difference in the wages of men and women in the workforce. According to International Labor Organization, women in Pakistan earn 34% less than men on an average. Globally, this gender pay gap is 20%. So women have to



face inequality even in economic sector. Apart from wages, women do not have opportunities in good sectors.

For women, employment opportunities are in the informal sectors, such as female labourers in industries or agricultural sectors and sometimes women are hired for just packaging of items. These kind of informal sectors provide opportunities to the women.

Apart from these factors social inequalities are also making the slogan "gender equality" more popular. Gender based violence and domestic violence are prevailing not only in Pakistan but all around the world. UN women's right committee report reveal that

there is a surge in gender based violence against women around the world. It increases 25% in 2022 compared to the previous years. In Pakistan around, 27.3% women facing sexual violence and 21.7% are facing physical violence. The gender based violence is a serious issue in Pakistan now a days. The ~~rural~~ rural areas and the communities of Afghan refugees are the places where domestic violence is prevailed to a great extent. Moreover

~~more~~ education and health disparities are also contributing to this trend. In Pakistan the female literacy rate is 51%. It shows that 49% of Pakistani women are illiterate. Especially in ~~poor~~

Some provinces for example KPK and Balochistan, where a major portion of girls never went to school. In KPK and Balochistan, the female literacy is 35% and 27% respectively. With this less literacy rate, Pakistan or any other country cannot develop. As we all are well aware of the saying;

"If you educate a man, you educate an individual; But if you educate a women, you educate a nation." In addition to it, women are also deprived of some basic social and legal rights. For instance, women in Pakistan are denied their rightful inheritance and Hug Mehar. In Islam, there is a fixed proportion for
