Case: Cuban Missile Crisis (1962)

Three qualities matter in an outline first one is organization of ideas

b- Conflict resolution by using the tools of diplomacy and mediation
Case: UN's role in Sudan Crisis (2019) - preventing a full-scale civil war

c- Harmonizing the actions of nations by attaining common goals
Case: Efforts for Climate Change - COPs

d- Promoting social progress and better standards of life

Case: UN SDGs (2015-2030)

e- Supporting Refugee Protection for humanitarian assistance

Case: Rohingya crisis (2017 - present)
provision of aid to over a million refugees
via UNHCR

4. How UN fails to maintain peace in the world at present?

a- Inability to prevent wars across the world
Case: Israel Palestine, Ukraine Russia wars.

b. It's actions fail to combat terrorism (the biggest social evil)

Case study of Pakistan- terrorism in KP and Balochistan

c. Security Council Paralysis due to Veto power of PS, leads to deadlock, hindering decisive action

Case: Syrian Civil War (2011)

d. Unable to resolve disputes among nations
Case: Kashmir - a political flashpoint b/w India and Pakistan

e. Failure of nuclear ^{non-}proliferation treaties
Case: North Korea - openly defying inter-
national norms and resolutions. Developed
nuclear weapons.
