Introduction

Women in Islam have gotten all sort of rights be it family, social, economic, political, religious, educational and marital rights. However, in other religions, women have been restricted to certain domains, undermining their personal autonomy and liberty.

How women have more rights in Islam than other religions.

- 1) Family right of women
 - a) Marital rights

Islam has conferred utmost rights to a wife in Islam. There are some of rights discussed below:

i) Right to consent

Women in Islam are strictly prohibited to be married without having their consent.

"Always take the consent of virgin girl; Moreover, the widow must also be asked before remarrying."

(Al-Hadith)

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ii) Right to Inheritance

Upon the death of husband, women has been conferred 1/6 of share of husband's estate.

"Men and women have property rights from the property leftover by parents and belongings."

In Judaism :

Women can only inherit if there are no sons.

iii) Right to maintenance

"And give to your women, who you marry, their mehr at the time of marriage with good heart."

(Surah Nisa 4:4)

In Hinduism :

Instead of showering women with amenities, there exist a concept of dowry - which is an extra burden of women, undermining their rights.

iv) Right to Khula (dissolution of marriage).

In certain scenarios, women have been given the right to terminate the marriage forthwith.

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However, there has to be legitimate reason.

"A women who takes Khula without any reason will be far from aroma of Paradise"

(Al - Hadith)

- In Christianity (catholicism)

In catholicism, the divorce is generally prohibited, limiting the woman's autonomy.

- In Hinduism

In Hinduism, marriage is often considered neverending bond and there are no laws allowing women to terminate marriage.

- b) Rights as a mother

- i, Right to be kind and gentle

Buran has strictly prohibited muslims to avoid harsh language with your mother and parents - father.

ii) Right to Inheritance

In Islamic law (Shariah) mothers are awarded a share of property from the assets of deceased son. Mothers are generally awarded $\frac{1}{8}$ of the property of deceased son. It is a economic right and a benefit that not every religion offers to mothers.

iii) Right to respect for foster mothers.

"Any one who breast feed a baby, holds the same respect as real mother." (Al-Quran).

c) Rights as daughters

Daughters in Islam are conferred a esteemed status. As Holy prophet says

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"Don't dislike daughters as they are more caring and loving for parents." (Al-Hadith)

Therefore, daughters hold a cardinal role in Islam.

2. Educational rights of women in Islam

Women in Islam are not banned but rather fostered to gain worldly and religious knowledge.

There are no any constraints on their educational pursuit.

"It is incumbent upon both Muslim women and men to acquire knowledge."

(Al-Hadith)

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3) Political rights of women in Islam

Islam has catalyzed women to indulge in politics. They may engage in political discourse and many engage in political campaigns.

- Right to vote

Example : The Lady Ayesha (Rig) is great example of women in politics.

- In Christianity :

In catholicism, women are barred from politics. Moreover, they can also not become priests in their church.

4) Economic rights of women in Islam

Islam has freed women to bear economic expenses, rather

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men are maintainers of them.

"Men are maintainers of

women because Allah has
made some of them to
excel others"

(Al-Qur'an)

Women are not banned but forced
to work and keep their earnings
to them.

Importance of Deen in Human life.

- 1) Deen confers a path to mankind

Deen is a spiritual notion that makes an individual far from materialism and mundane intricacies. Moreover, Surah Yasin, the words of God in

Qur'an holds true wisdom and pathway to human efforts.

3) Deen : An criterion of morality

Deen is an ideology that defines what is wrong and right. It is clear pathway to truth and peace. Moreover it also forestalls individuals from being stray and consult human-made sources in case of guidance. As Allah mentioned in Quran ;

"And in month of Ramadan,
Qur'an was revealed, a

(AL-Qur'an)

4) Deen : An antidote to melancholy and sorrows of world

Deen is collective ideology that covers the every area of human life. In the divine book of Quran, there exist the true guidance and spiritual teachings for mankind. It can help individuals forget all sorrows of world. Allah mentions in Quran that ;

(Al-Qur'an)

(Al-Quran)

- 2) Deen is a static ideology, but religion is of evolving nature.

Deen and religion are different ideologies.


- 3) Deen is Islam, and the religion is sects and partisans made therein.
