It is a way of acquiring better opportunities in foreign country, it provides an escape from the social unrest and political turmoil in one's own country, it provides better education and learning opportunities, it gives better health-care facilities to emigrants, one can save oneself from the hazardous impacts of pollution and Brain Drain is also a way of improving socio-economic conditions of developing countries.

In 2000 almost 75 million people, or 2.9 percent of the world's population, were living outside their country of birth for more than a year. Of these about 65 million were economically

active. This form of migration has in the past involved many health professionals, nurses and physicians have sought employment abroad for many reasons including high unemployment in their country. In 1972 about 6 percent

richer and poorer countries offer a greater 'pull' towards the more developed countries.

continues to persecute religious minorities
and punish residents in areas
under their strict interpretation of
Shariah law. Moreover, severe
restrictions on women's rights are
also causing migration of educated
and independent women. Gender
inequality is one of the significant
reasons of Brain Drain. Even in
21st century women are facing
extreme gender discriminations in
almost developing countries. Current
Taliban government in Afghanistan
has imposed inhumane restrictions
on women, which is a significant
step to exclude women from
all spheres of life and confine
them within the four walls of
their houses. To avoid this kind of

women have been grappling with

gender disparities. many skilled and professional women including doctors, engineers and journalists have migrated to other countries.

Terrorism is a significant factor that is pushing the youth to leave their own country. try to make more assertive and strong statements

Developing countries like Afghanistan and Pakistan are struggling with terrorism. which is a cause of social unrest. The sense of insecurity and fear compels young and highly qualified population to migrate to developed countries like USA and UK where terrorism is comparatively less than the developing countries. Here comes the political turmoil which forces people to leave their country of birth and live in more developed countries. In developing countries like Pakistan and India political instability is increasing. Political instability hinders economic growth as well as overall development of the country and its people. Political instability in the country impedes the dream of a bright future. As in Pakistan political instability is a cause of stagnant economy and deterioration of education system. The people of Pakistan has to face internet disruptions, road blocks and closure of schools and colleges during the days of political unrest. Moreover, due to political polarization freedom of speech in developing countries have become a far distant dream. To live more peaceful and free life people of developing nations migrate to developed countries. Because of

political turmoil businessmen prefer to leave the country instead of investing in it. Many journalists have fled Pakistan in recent years. The exodus is driven by security fears. A 2023 report from Freedom Network, an Islamabad based civil liberties organization, echoed concerns, noting a more than 60 percent increase in threats and attacks against journalists over the past years. So in order to live a peaceful and fearless life Brain Drain proves itself better than Brain in the Drain.

Fourth comes the major reason of Brain Drain, better education and learning opportunities. Young, well-educated and healthy individuals are most likely to migrate, especially in pursuit of higher education and better learning. In developing countries investment in education and research areas are very less as compared to developed

~~countries~~ The majority of doctors acquire specialized and post graduate professional qualifications in developed countries. As among the doctoral graduates in science and engineering in the USA in 1995, 79 percent of those were from India.

The recent study on brain drain from 24 countries published by the World Bank also showed that most of the immigrants to the USA are from South Asian countries. More demand of high skilled people by high tech and research and development (R&D) industries attract people from developing countries. Furthermore,

and 10 times more patents than their counterparts at home. Why is there such a vast difference in productive capacity? The context and conditions in which science and technology are able to prosper because political decision, funding, infrastructure, technical support and a scientific community. These are generally unavailable in developing countries. Hence there are more opportunities of learning and industry in developed countries than in underdeveloped countries. So scientists, doctors, scholars and other professionals chose Brain Drain over Brain in the Drain.

Five comes the most concerning issue of developing and underdeveloped countries, poor health-care facilities. In developed countries health-care facilities are better and advanced because in many developing countries health-care

systems are suffering from years of under investment. According to an article published in Journal of the Royal Society of Medicine, health expenditure in India is 3 percent of GDP compared to 13 percent of GDP in the USA and the ratio of doctor to patient in India is 1:2083 compared to the USA where the ratio is 1:500.

In addition to poor investment the negligence in hospitals in under-developed and developing countries is another prominent cause of concern. For example in one of the renowned hospitals of Pakistan HIV has spread due to the negligence of the staff and the administration. In these circumstances Brain Drain provides a way of getting better and efficient health-care facilities in developed countries.

Due to increase in air pollution the air quality of many developing countries including Pakistan and India has deteriorated.~~ According to **DAWN** newspaper the Air Quality Index in one of the cities of ^{Pakistan} crossed 1000 in which ^{November 2024} is dangerously more than the standard AQI set by WHO. While in developed countries like USA the average AQI in 2023 was 28, ^{which} falls in the range of Good Air quality. Rising air pollution is posing serious health problems such as respiratory illnesses. According to WHO estimates of death rate attributable to outdoor air pollution, more than 140,000 people in Pakistan died from Air pollution in 2019. Hence good air quality and better life and health conditions attract people to
