Brain drain is actually the emigration of highly trained or qualified people from a particular country.

Brain drain is neither a new issue nor it is the fully settled one. Every country is facing this problem. The developed countries are dealing with it successfully but the developing countries are still struggling. Unfortunately Pakistan ~~was~~<sup>is</sup> one of them. Along with other many problems, brain drain is also an untractable challenge for Pakistan. The causes of brain drain are not descended from

Moving towards the causes of brain drain, the main reason behind the brain drain in Pakistan is financial strain. As in Pakistan there are very few opportunities for our educated youth. Many highly educated individuals are rendering job-less. So, the unemployment rate in Pakistan is increasing day by day. When the highly educated and skilled population does not get the opportunities here, they will definitely move abroad in the search of better opportunities. Over 11.3 Million Pakistanis have sought better opportunities abroad. <sup>in 2023.</sup> The unemployment rate in Pakistan is 8.0% in 2024. The government of Pakistan is

unable to provide jobs to the educated citizens. Unfortunately, the country has many P.h) doctors who are selling fruits on the streets. So, obviously these kind of conditions compels the people to leave their own country. Hence lack of opportunities is a reason behind brain drain.

Secondly, another factor that leads to brain drain is poor salaries <sup>and raised inflation.</sup> The very few individuals who are lucky enough to get a job in Pakistan, face the problem of low salaries. They cannot support their families with this meagre income. For instance, the

the pay scale for MBBS doctors in Pakistan ranges from per year is 5,427,734 PKR. But the pay for the same doctor in Canada would be 55,044,002 PKR. So, this is the difference that incentivizes the people to leave their own country. Furthermore, the rising inflation is also a concern for the wage earners. With the meagre and stagnant wages, it's difficult for everyone to survive, when the inflation rate touching the skies. From July 2023 to February 2024, inflation rate reached to an average of 27.96% and number of people migrating to other countries during the same period was in thousands.

So, the rising inflation rate and poor salaries is also another reason behind the brain drain in Pakistan.

Moreover, the low standard of living is also another incentive. Be it, health ~~department~~ <sup>department</sup>, education department, or any other department, they are unable to provide the better living conditions. As many people in the country describe the condition of hospitals or the health facilities by saying that "May God Save <sup>even</sup> my worst enemy from disease and Pakistani hospitals." Amid these conditions, the people avoid to go to hospitals and they try to move to developed

than average. A report in  
2022 revealed that Pakistan's  
education system was not  
able to produce even a  
single scientist. This <sup>situation</sup> is ~~the~~  
worrisome. With this kind of  
education system we will  
not be able to compete  
in this world of science  
and technology. So, the

Apart from financial causes, some social issues are also responsible for brain<sup>drain</sup>. Among these issues, the first one is the threat to personal safety and security. As the law and order situation in the country is not so good. Terror attacks are increasing as well. So the citizens do not feel safe here. They have no idea, whether they will comeback home safely while leaving the home. A report issued by PAPS documented 27 terrorist attacks in Pakistan in June 2024. So, it's very obvious that no one feels safe under such circumstances. Ultimately, they decide to leave the country. Moreover, the

increasing crime rate is also a factor behind this street crimes witnessed a surge in 2024. Assault, robbery, kidnapping and even rape cases reached to a level that is concerning for every-one. All these crimes are not confined to Karachi, <sup>anymore,</sup> but it's hurting every part of the country. So, this poor law and order situation leads to migration of ~~country~~ <sup>people</sup> from their own country. Among the social causes, the most prominent cause is the society pressure. When <sup>any</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>individual</sup> ~~young~~ does not get a job even after being so educated, the people starts ~~to~~ criticizing them. Especially the boys, who face

this pressure to a greater extent. There is a pressure on them to get a job, to support their families, and to reduce the burden of their parents. Eventually when they are not able to do this in their own country, they decide to move ~~the~~ to another country.

Sometime, the young population have to face <sup>this pressure</sup> to the extent, that even they are willing to move to another country by illegal means and then they have to face the consequences of it as well. But the social pressure is another reason of brain drain.

Moving forward with the causes, another prominent cause of brain drain is political instability. Here in

Pakistan, the democracy has become an endangered phenomenon. There is no hope for political stability in our country. Moreover, political polarization has become so intense in our country that there is a fear of persecution and discrimination on the basis of political beliefs. In these conditions, there is no hope for any kind of political stability in near future. Moreover, corruption of our political leaders and governments made the conditions even more worse. Recently a report <sup>was</sup> published with the title of "Top 10 most corrupt politicians in the world", and a former Prime Minister of Pakistan was placed on top of the list. So, this

is how our rulers run the country. The corruption of the leaders puts pressure on the country's economy and resources and eventually, the public has to bear heavy taxes to compensate the losses. Not only political stability and corruption but the miserable condition of "justice system" is also another reason. The ~~justice~~ <sup>judicial</sup> system of Pakistan is manipulated to this extent that there is no hope left for the common people. This system will only provide justice to the influential and elite class. The poor and common public will only face injustice or unnecessary delays. Looks like our justice system has not learnt

So, all these factors  
collectively contribute to  
the migration of people  
to other countries.

Additionally, brain drain  
is also triggered by some  
religious causes. Extremism, cases  
related to blasphemy are  
on a surge now. We  
need not to look far, but the  
recent incidents provide ample  
examples. Recently Shah Nawaz, a  
32-year old doctor was shot dead  
by police, because he was  
~~involved~~ accused of being  
involved in blasphemy. So,  
this pattern of ~~blasphemy~~ <sup>violence</sup>  
in cases of blasphemy

is an alarming trend. No one feels safe under such circumstances. Extremism is also hitting the country hard. Syed Atiq Raza; CEO of Vissec Systems was a lecturer at Punjab university. one day his wife, who was also a lecturer in the same university was dragged out of her class by some students aligned with a socio-political party. After the incident, persistent threats of death led to the family's flight from Pakistan and they left. Today he is ~~the~~ recognised as a pioneer in IT. So, this is how extremism and blasphemy are damaging the very roots of our country and contributing to the brain drain.

Lastly, the another factor that drive brain drain is "Administrative loopholes. It include bribery, <sup>and</sup> Nepotism. Nepotism is the practice among those with power and influence of favoring relatives by giving them jobs. This is very common in Pakistan and is not limited to some institutions, but it's everywhere. ~~with~~ There is a perception among the public that whenever any institution, either government or ~~public~~ <sup>Private,</sup> issues an advertisement for any kind of job, the candidates ~~are~~ <sup>have</sup> already been selected some very deserving candidates are left with nothing because of this trend. Another evil that forces the people to consider migration is "Bribery"

Whether it be police, courts, educational institute or any other department, bribery is common everywhere. In a country where there are already very less opportunities for the people, bribery further exacerbates the <sup>poor situation</sup> ~~resources~~ leading the people to move to another country in the search of opportunities.

All these causes have adverse effects on our country.

Starting with the consequences of brain drain, dearth of intellectuals in the country is the foremost effect of brain drain. When highly skilled individuals leave the country then obviously there is a decrease of talent and increase of low-skilled population in the country. The CEO of

Secondly, brain drain also causes family gap. When one or both the parents move towards another country leaving behind their children with their grand-parents or some relatives, children may feel disconnected from the parents. It leads to less interaction and reduced bonding between the family. The children may also feel emotional strain such as loneliness, depression or anxiety. Sometimes, the children have to take on additional responsibilities and it can affect their well-being and development. Additionally, it causes generation and cultural gap. The emigrants may assimilate into the culture of their new country, leading to differences in cultural values and practices between family members.

Last but not the least,  
† another sector that is being  
effected by the brain drain  
is economy of Pakistan. The  
loss of revenues is the most  
common among the economic  
losses. When highly skilled professio-  
nals leave the country, Pakistan  
loses a portion of its potential  
tax base. These professionals  
would have contributed to income  
taxes, had they remained  
here. The government of Pakistan  
invest heavily in education  
and training of professionals. When  
these individuals leave the  
country, the return on this  
investment is lost, as their skills  
benefit other economies, not  
Pakistan's. Moreover the foreign investors  
prefer to invest in the countries  
with high skilled labour force.  
So, the foreign investment also  
**decreases** due to dearth of

intellectuals. Another potent effect is the increased dependence on remittances. When the skilled population leaves a country, then the only way by which they can help their country is the "remittances". The government also seek great amount of remittances, when it's not able to collect the enough taxes. It can also lead to increased imports and decrease exports. Because, due to the absence of domestic talent forces, Pakistan and any other country has to rely on foreign expertise which can be costly and leads to trade deficit; the problem already hammering the Pakistan's economy. So, the issue of brain drain has serious and long-lasting effects on the economy.
