(2) Historical exploration;



Historically sought by explorers since the 15th century. It was envisioned as a shortcut to Asia. Roald Amundsen successfully navigated it from 1903 to 1906, making a significant achievement in Arctic exploration. The passage is now increasingly relevant due to climate change.

(3) Strategic importance;

The Northwest Passage has been an important strategic location for the United States in terms of National Security. During Cold War, the United States maintained a military presence in the Arctic to monitor Soviet activities, which has made more for raising geopolitical tensions over sovereignty between USA and Canada.

(4) Economic Potential ;

(4) Social Consequences:






