1/ Introduction

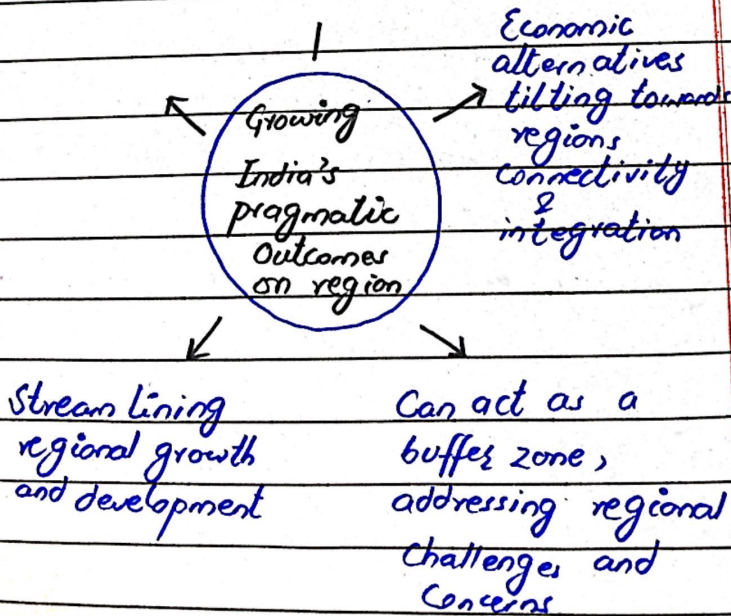

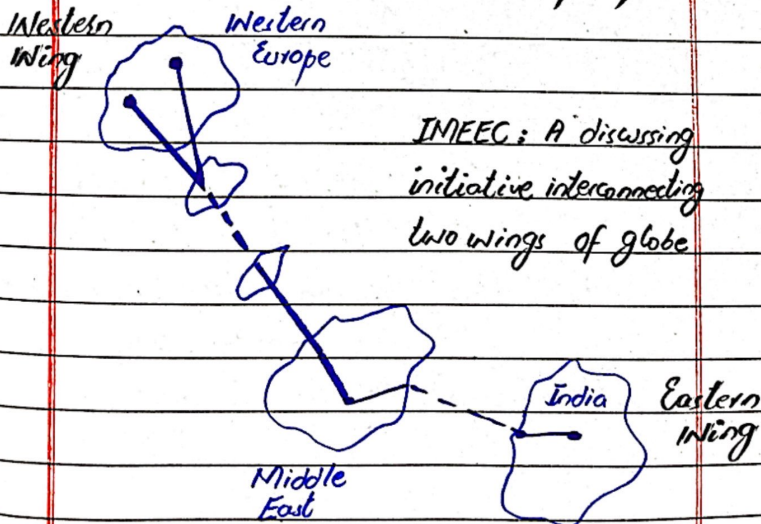
2) Implications of India's growing position on region's strategic dynamics

economic & trade alternatives

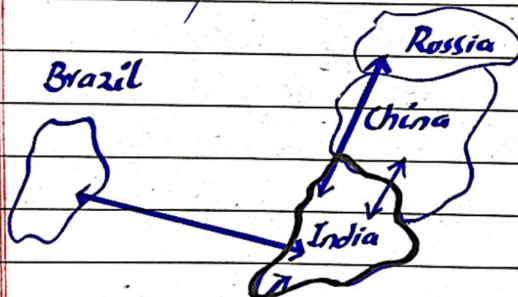
India can act as a pivot

India's active participation in global and regional organizations can cast a spell over region streamling their patterns of growth and development.



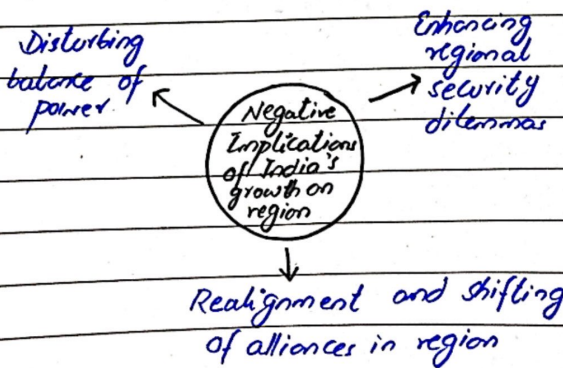

India can play its role in addressing common concerns of security, poverty, terrorism, public health issues and natural disasters, being a member of SAARC and SCO.

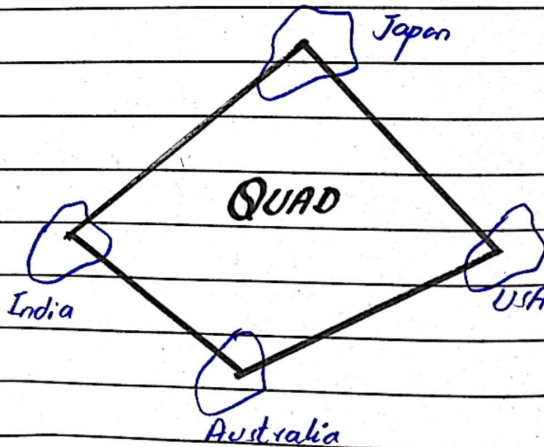
3) Negative concerns of India's

(A) India's enhancing military capabilities - Regional security dilemmas

India's enhanced defensive capabilities due to strategic partnership with West under QUAD poses security dilemma for regional states.



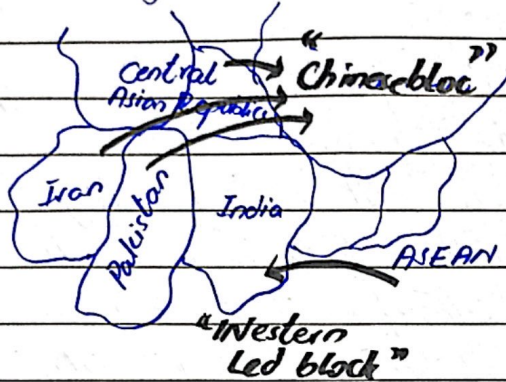
(B) India's growing economic and military might can disturb balance of power in region

Therefore, being a western ally, India is joining multifold alliances to accommodate and contain the growing China, which in turn is disturbing the balance of power in region.

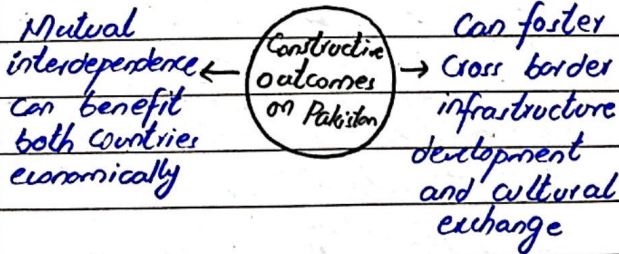
(C) Realignment and shifts in alliances associated with power dynamics owing to India's growing regional concerns

side either western led bloc or Chinese bloc, creating uncertain environment and chaos in South Asian region.

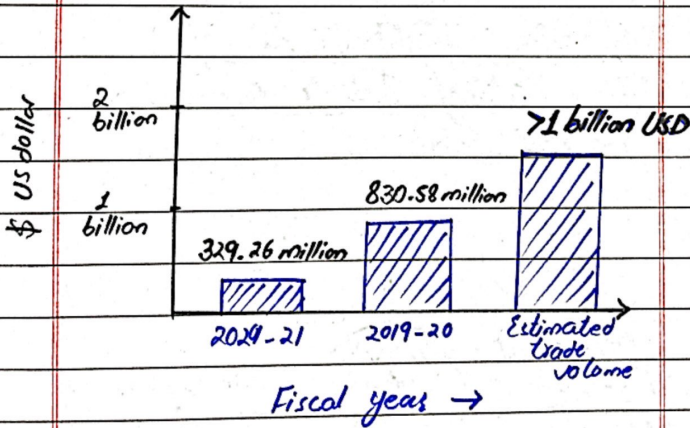


4/ Constructive Outcomes of India:

and interconnectivity

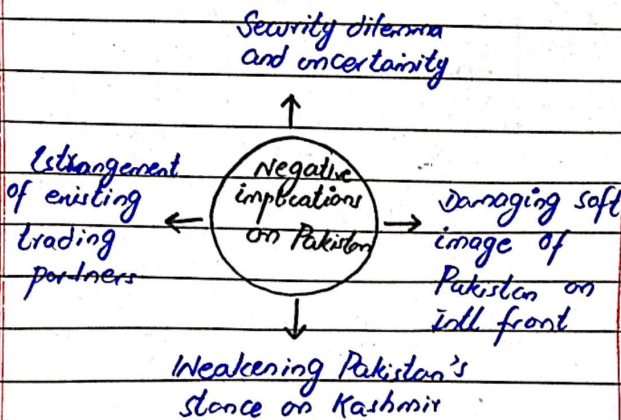
Pakistan and India has a potential to trade, cooperate and integrate with each other through mutual cooperation and interdependence, both historic rivals can grow economically.



(B) Pakistan India can foster cross border infrastructure development and cultural exchanges

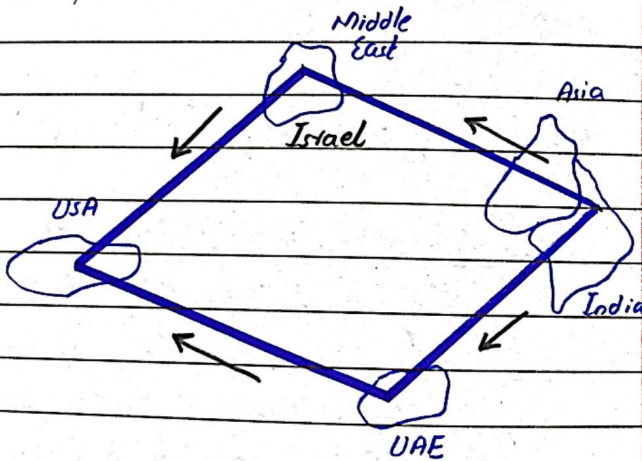
By softening the border between Pakistan and India, both countries can benefit through exchange of culture, traditions and projects of infrastructural growth and development.

(A) Security Dilemma and Uncertainty for Pakistan
