would then explain their conduct in question. In Itiam, there is no room for authorities to be immune from law. Even the head of an Islamic state may be challenged, in both official and private capacity, in the court. The office of a judge is independent of all executive control and he can exercise his authority without any form of interference from in fivential quarters. He decides all disputes in light of the Ovran and the Sunnah: 'So Judge between them by that which Allah has revealed " (Strat AL Maide). (3) Accountability of Ruler of an Islamic State

The very essence of an Islamic State is that sovereignty belongs to Allah and the sovereignty exercised by the rulers in an Islamic State is a sacred trust bestowed on them by Allah: Then we appointed you Viceroys in the land after them that we might see how you behave. Gurah Al Mulk). The rulers on earth are to practice and implement

the commands of Allah which have been laid down in the Owan

#### (3.1) Responsibiliter of an Islamic State

The primary focus of an Islamic State is the promotion and endorsement of themselfing of Islam. At the same time, it operates to provide safety and protection to the people of the state. It also looks after the people's welfare.

### (3.2) Appointment of the ruler of an Islamic State

The ruler of an Islamic State is appointed through consultation. Allah says in the Ouran:

"And those who respond to their Lord and keep up prenger, and where affairs are (decided) by counsel among themselves..."

(Sureh Ash - Shura). The most important example is the appointment of Caliph Abu Bake by conducting mutual consultation. Once appointed, the ruler has to manage all affairs by consulting those around him.

(3.3) Obedience to the ruler

It is obligatory for the people to listen to the ruler of an Irlamic State. In the cure where a ruler deviate from the right path , he is no longer entitled to obedience by the people. The Holy Prophet (PRUH) said: 'A Muslim has to listen to and obey ( the order of his ruler), whether he likes it Ir not, as long as his our orders do not involve disobedience (to Allah). But if and an let of disobedience to Allah is impored, one should not listen to 11 orobey it. ? It also becomes evident that The accountability of a rule of an Islamic State is two fold; He is answerable to God, as power bestweed on him by Gd is a sacred trust and he is answerable to the people who are his subjects.

# (4) Accountability of Judiciary in an Islamic State

A judge is required to dean be impartial and decide on those the marits of the case uninfluenced by external strains. Allah says in the Quran: 'O you who believe, be maintained of Justice, bearers of withers for Allah, even though it be against yourselver or your near relatives.

Whether a rich man or a pour man ... '(Surch An Nisa).

# (4.1) Case of a Noble Woman who had committed

He said "Verily those who were before you were destroyed because when a hoble man from oxmong them committed theft, they parsed no sentence on him. # (42) Responsibility of Judger

Helah says in the Ovan: Surely we have revealed the book to the with truth that move may judge between people by means of what Allah has tought thee. And be not one pleading the case of the dishoneit! (Surah An-Visa). It is the duty of the judges to ensure that justice is served.

# (4.3) Accompability of Judger

Like the rilers, the judges are also answerble to Good. The Italy Prophet (PBUH) once said:

"Judges are of Three types, one of when will go to paradise and two to Hell. The one who kwill go to paradise is a man who knows what is right and giver judgement accordingly; but a man who knows what is right and acts tyranhically in his judgement will go to Hell and a man who gives judgement for people when he is ignorant will go to Hell. This is how strict the system of accountability in Islam is.

# (44) Conduct of Jusiciary under Plour Khilafat

The pious caliphs issued detailed instructions about qualification, appointment and conduct of judger.
