Thesis

- 2i) Perfecting a balance between bilateral and multilateral relations
- 2j) Strengthening accountability <sup>mechanisms in</sup> of ICC and ICJ towards perpetrators of war crimes and genocide - Stringent penalty
- 3) The world war three seems like an inevitable danger: <sup>The other</sup> <sub>side of picture</sub>
- 3a) Growing tensions between nuclear powers could end up taking world into smouldering ruins. However, non-nuclearization ~~and~~ efforts of NPT and IAEA can deter the threat.
- 3b) The rise of China as a global hegemon is creating a Thucydides trap that would eventually lead to the war. However, China pursues the policy of peaceful existence and win-win economic growth.



3c) The failure of United Nations in preventing Russia-Ukraine and Gaza-Israel war signify the future escalation of conflicts into war and eventually into world war. However, UN is successful in advocacy against human rights atrocities and giving a platform to raise issues.

3d) Acquisition of modern technology and pinpoint accuracies in air strikes could pave a way for escalation of conflicts into full-fledge war. However, technologies are prone to cyber attacks and could be used as a direct weapon in wars.

4) Conclusion

Throughout history, moments of great change have emerged not from consensus but from conflict and struggle. From French revolution to American revolution and to the recent Feminism movements, the world has always witnessed progress through conflicts and struggle. These developments, while temporarily inflicting a cost, proved instrumental in a longer run. In short, deepening faultlines between states could lead to a scourge of world war if not prevented timely. There comes a question to one's mind. How can we prevent the third world war. A number of reforms and measures are required to prevent the prospects of world war then. First of all, the most agreeable way is to foster the environment of dialogue, cooperation and peaceful existence between the states, & strengthening the role of United Nations and its peacekeeping missions. Also, leveraging the regional organizations for the peaceful resolution of disputes, increasing trade cooperation other than the sole military alliances and perfecting a balance between bilateral and multilateral <sup>relations</sup> ~~disputes~~ could significantly deter the threat of world war then. Similarly, expanding non-nuclearization efforts, containing the policy of Israel by USA and strengthening accountability mechanisms in ICC and ICJ could also hamper the <sup>escalation</sup> ~~spread~~ of conflicts into third world war. Likewise, reducing the nationalist and ideologists tendencies of state and shaping global public opinion through mass media can also lead to the retraction of state's policies towards fuelling third world war. These measures suggest that the world could be changed into better ~~than~~ by taking these steps. However, an echo from the other side of



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debate unfolds the inevitability of third world war due to various reasons. Growing tensions between nuclear powers like china and US, rise of china as a global hegemon, creating a thucydides trap and failure of united nations in preventing wars pose a question mark on the prospects of third world war. These concerns hold a significant but not so convincing position in 21<sup>st</sup> century, where the worlds are inclined towards economic cooperation and peaceful existence to create a win-win situation for both sides.
