Introduction

وَلِلَّهِ عَلَى النَّاسِ حِجُّ الْبَيْتِ مَنِ اسْتَطَاعَ إِلَيْهِ سَبِيلًا

"Hajj is obligatory only on those financially and physically capable"
(Surat Aal-e-Imran: 97)

The Hajj is an annual pilgrimage to Makkah and a mandatory religious duty for Muslims that must be carried out at least once in their lifetime by all adult Muslims, who are physically and financially capable of undertaking the journey and can support their family during their absence. It is one of

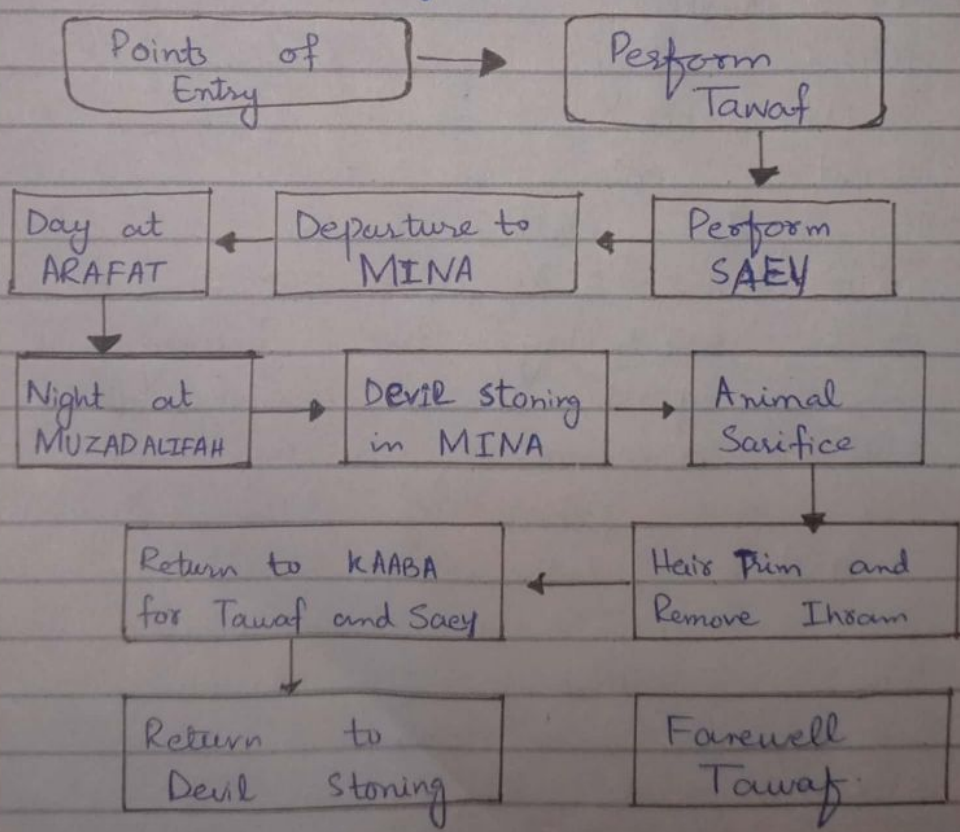
the five pillars of Islam, alongside Shahadah, Salat, Zakat, and Siyam.

The Hajj is a demonstration of the solidarity of Muslim people and their submission to God.

The word Hajj means "to intend a journey". The pilgrimage is a five days journey activity that occurs from the 8th to 12th of Dhu-al-Hijah, the last month

of the Islamic calendar. It represents more than just a facet of Islam because of the profound impacts it has on Muslim's social (Equality, Brotherhood, Social reformation, end of sectarian violence), moral (Helps cultivate resilience, Patience and tolerance, Moral behavior) ^{and} Spiritual (Closeness to Allah, sense of purity, Leads to taqwa) lives.

Basic Obligations of Hajj



Social, Moral and Spiritual Impacts

1- Social Impacts:

- 1.1- Create a sense of equality without any discrimination.

The Hajj rites promotes humility and lessen arrogance by emphasizing that all Muslims, regardless of social, or economic standing are equal before Allah. In addition, pilgrims wear white clothes, which stands for equality and purity, entering a condition known as Ihram. This clothing removes social barriers and promotes equality. As the Holy Prophet said;

"No Arab has any superiority over a non-Arab, nor does a non-Arab have any superiority over an Arab. Nor does a white man have any superiority over a black man, or the black man have any superiority over the white man.

Thus, Muslim face one way and surrender to Will of the Almighty.

• 1.2 Uplift sense of Brotherhood

Verily, Islam is the religion of people peace and unity. God repeatedly tells believers in Quran to 'stick' together and find strength in togetherness. This togetherness is embodied in Hajj. As Allah said in Quran;

"O humanity, Indeed, we created you from a male and female and made you into peoples and tribes so that you may get to know one another. Surely, the most noble among you in the sight of Allah is the most righteous among you. Allah is truly all-knowing, All-Aware"

(Surah - Al-Hujrat: 13)

The Hajj rites strongly emphasise forgiveness, peace and togetherness.

• 1.3 Source of Social Reformation

Hajj makes different clans, tribes and nations to interact with each other. It becomes a source of social reformation among them. It overhauls all the defective qualities of a nation and make them practice

new social practices which inspire them towards good.

•1.4 - End of Sectarian Violence

In today's world, sectarianism has become a growing concern in the agitation among the Muslims. Terrorism and extremism have occurred from these sectarian differences and is being becoming a major hurdle in the unity of Muslims. Hajj teach us to put our sectarian differences aside, and be united and only bow before Allah. As said in Quran

إِنَّ الَّذِينَ فَرَّقُوا دِينَهُمْ كَمَا نَزَّلْنَا نَبِيًّا لَسْتَ مِنْهُمْ فِي شَيْءٍ وَإِنَّمَا أُمُورُهُمْ إِلَى اللَّهِ تَوَكَّلْ أَيْنَمَا تَكُونُ

"Verily, as for those who have broken the unity of their faith and have become sects, you have nothing do with them"
(Quran 6:159)

2 - Moral Impacts:

• 2.1 - Helps Cultivative Resilience
The Hajj puts pilgrims

tolerance and fortitude to test on both physical and emotional level. This experience fosters resilience and the capacity to bear adversity with fortitude and faith. Prophet PBUH said in Hadith; "There are no days in which righteous deeds are more blessed than these ten days." The people asked, "Not even Jihad for the sake of Allah?" He (PBUH) said, "Not even Jihad for the sake of Allah except in case of a man ^{went} without, giving himself and his wealth for the cause (of Allah) and come back with Nothing." (Al-Bukhari)

Additionally, Pilgrims who complete Hajj acquire moral strength that they apply to their everyday lives.

• 2.2- Promotes Patience and Tolerance:

Obviously, the most important factor that hajj promotes is perhaps patience and tolerance. When a person sacrifices and distributes it to needy, he can tell from their faces how much it means to them. The trot between Safa and Marwa (al-sa'ay) signifies strength and

hope in time of adversity and did the mother of Ismail who was left in Makka with no water and was running between the two hillocks in fear and hope until delivered her and her son from danger.

- 2.3 - Focus on moral behavior

Hajj travellers are motivated to live more ethical lives that uphold Islam's moral precepts by their experience on the pilgrimage. During the Hajj, man reaches a condition of complete holiness, which forbids him from endangering the lives or well-being of any other person. Additionally, it fosters feelings of justice, charity, honesty and patience toward other people.

"The Islamic ethic is that if God has given you the capacity or good fortune to be a privileged individual, you have a moral responsibility to society."
(Aga Khan)

3- Spiritual Impacts:

• 3.1 Closeness to Allah

The Hajj is a religious ritual that draws pilgrims close to Allah. The Hajj rites includes standing at Arafat and Tawaf, help Muslims become more religious and aware of God's presence. As Allah says in Quran; "And, [mention] when We made the House (Kaaba) a place of return for the people and (a place of) security. And take, (O believers), from the standing place of Abraham a place of prayer. And we charged Abraham and Ismael (saying), "Purify My House for those who perform Tawaf and those who are staying (there) for worship and those who bow and prostrate (in prayer)." (Al-Baqarah: 125)

Moreover, Hajj pilgrims feel spiritual emancipation and their hearts draw nearer to Allah.

• 3.2 - A Sense of Purity and ~~taqwa~~ entrenched into Muslim's heart.

Pilgrims frequently feel an intense sensation of refreshment and cleansing. The adherence to Islamic values is strengthened by the voyage. Which serves as

a reminder of their ultimate goal.
Narrated Abu Huraira: The Holy
Prophet (PBUH) said;

وَأَنَّ الْحَاجَّ يَلْعَنُ كَيَوْمَ وُلِدَتْ أُمُّهُ.

"A person who perform Hajj
purifies himself from sins like
the day that he was born".

(Shahih Bukhari)

Furthermore, a genuine pilgrimage
is thought to be able to
purge Muslims of their sins, much
like a rebirth, giving them a
fresh start and a pure soul.

• 3.3 - Hajj leads to Taqwa
Zakat enhances Muslims. Every
good act done in the
name of Allah enhances the
taqwa of the Muslims. If the
act done is replication of
the ways of the Prophet. Therefore
spending money in Allah's way
increase Taqwa.

Conclusion:

Islam is a comprehensive way
of life, and all rituals including
Hajj, have transformed individual
social, moral and spiritual lives.

Spiritually, it offers a path to atonement and forgiveness. It promotes ethical behaviors, modesty and self control. Nevertheless, socially, it fosters harmony and peace. Through the Hajj, Muslims - who represent the true spirit of Islam - renew their moral obligations, strengthen their bond with global Ummah, and declare their loyalty to Allah once more.
