Help of the poor.

"Verily, Allah has ordained the payment of Zakat on them. It will be taken from the rich and returned to the poor".

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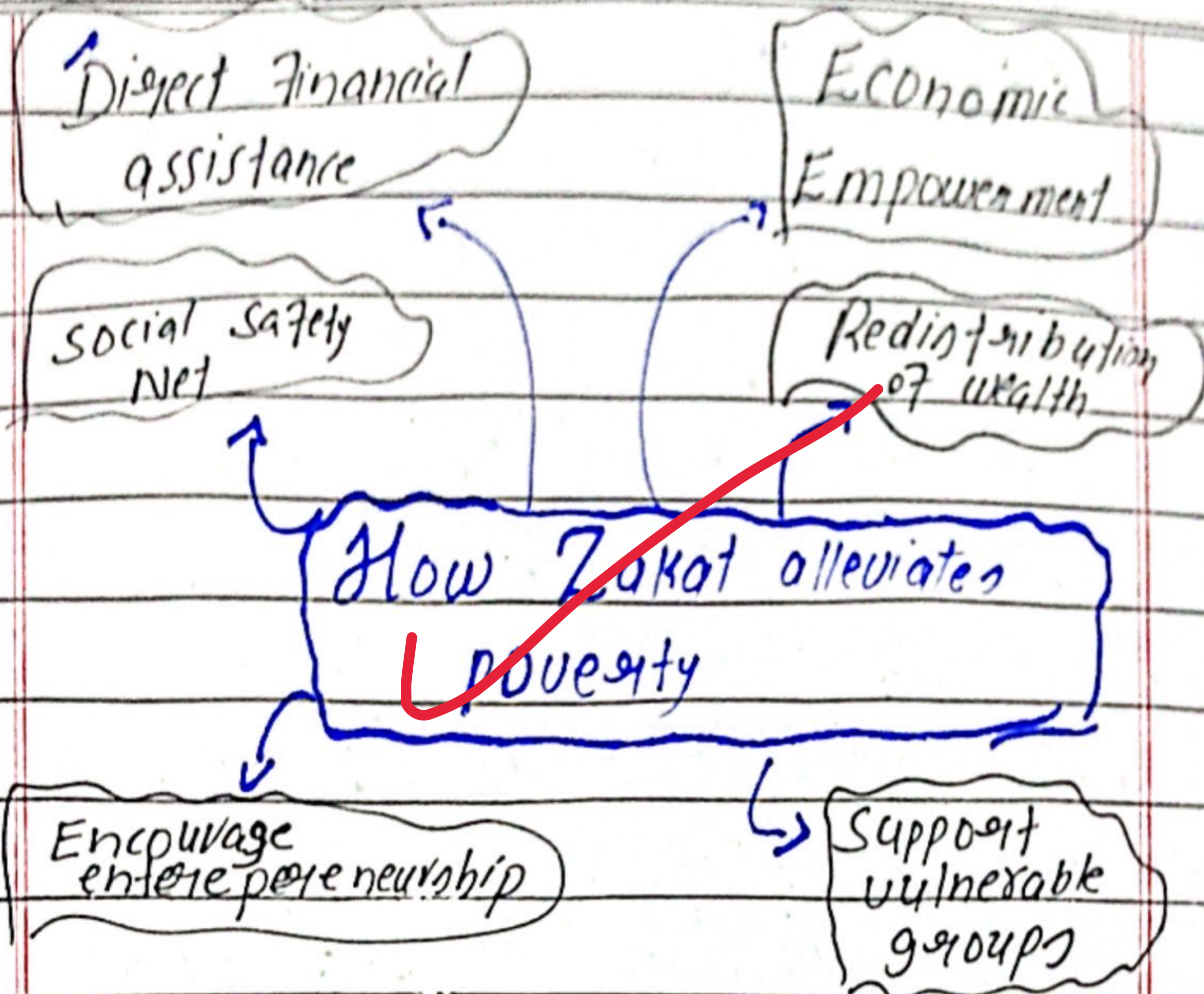
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On the other hand, unlike capitalism, zakat prevents the concentration of wealth and promotes social welfare.
