The Pew Research Center found that 64% of adults with lower level of literary in the US had difficulty in distinguishing between factual and opinion based statements this was clearly shown in 2016 election of US in which misinformation was weaponized in democracy. Illiterary fosters blurring of truth, making democracy more endangered.
