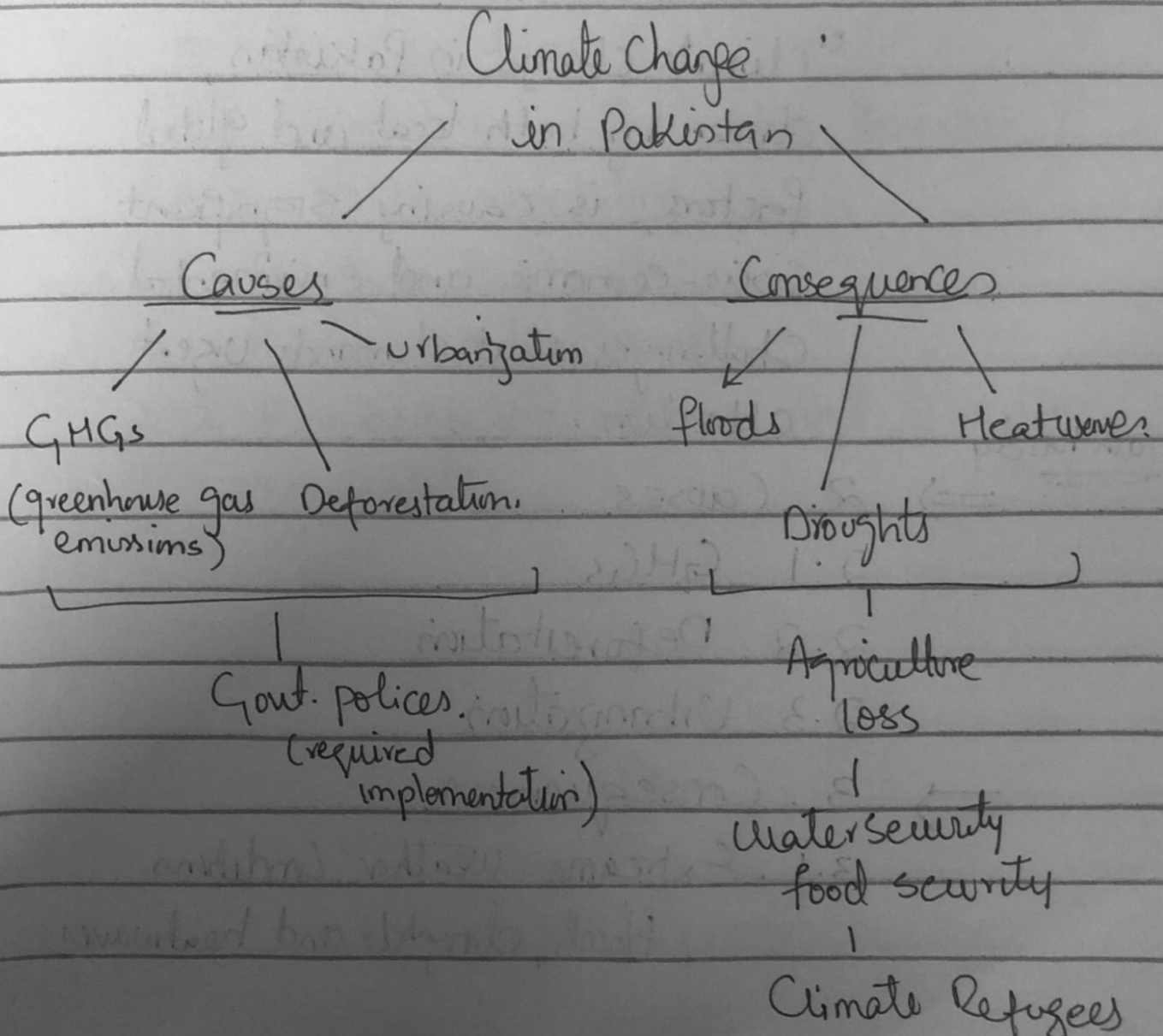

Introduction:

"I have never seen climate carnage on this scale". These were the words of UN Secretary-General António Guterres as he toured flood hit regions of Pakistan in 2022.

Climate change is no longer a distant threat it is a present reality that is reshaping societies across the globe. For countries like Pakistan, the effects of climate change are not just environmental, but deeply social, economic and political. Despite contributing less than 1% to global greenhouse gas emissions, Pakistan ranks among the most vulnerable nations to climate change. The causes of this vulnerability are rooted in both internal factors - such as deforestation and unregulated urbanization and the external
