levels. Major of the drug addicts within youth are under

18 and these individuals face high levels of stress within

stress are life-problems such as financial dependence on parents and lack of jobs. Many of the students have to do part time jobs to pay their feeses and earn some bread for

who are not studying, work for 12-14 hours per day to earn a decent amount. This high level of labor is tiring and demands some escape, which the youth finds in

drugs. Furthermore, the pressure from the family impacts

the mentality of these youngsters. They are asked odd questions such as "how much do you earn?", "why are you not getting married?", "why are you not getting a job?". They are compared

with their cousins, their friends and their neighbors. They are told, that their families have very high expectations from

them and they have to fulfill those expectations. This increased ~~physical~~ and mental stress causes depression, self-question and then drugs seem the only way to escape them.

One other reason for the drug addiction within youth is the failure of law enforcing agencies. Today, drugs have become extremely common. They are being sold in almost every town; on most of the streets. One reason for it is the failure ~~for~~ of the border patrol which leads to the cross border transport of these drugs. USA and Pakistan are the prime examples of this cross border transport of drugs. Mexican and Colombian white powder or heroine has been effecting US youth, while Afghani green chilli or Chars/Ganja are effecting Pakistan's youth leading to their decline. Moreover, from these border areas the drugs reach every corner of the country which shows the failure of Police department and Drug regulating authorities such as DEA or exercise department. They are sold openly on the streets without any restrictions. Even the pupils of age below 10 are exposed to these highly dangerous substances. This clearly shows the level of corruption, these state institutes are submerged in. Not only the narcotics are being sold ~~only~~ openly because of the corruption within police department, but also highly euphoric medicines are being sold to any one without any ~~Drugs~~ prescription. Some of these medicines are cough syrups which contain narcotics, brain smoothing substances. According to a BBC report, many of the youngsters within African countries drink 5-8 cough syrups daily for ecstasy and joy. This

Shows the level of corruption within these drug regulating authorities also. This failure of law enforcing agencies clearly points to the increase of drug addiction within youth.

Moreover, the increase of drug addiction within youth is also linked to their easy availability. The drugs have become very common that they are found everywhere and ^{are} easily accessible. Because of this, a youngster today relies more on them rather than on psychological therapies if he finds himself stressed or disturbed. These drugs are sold on stores, cabins and shops in the immediate neighborhood and are easy to buy and use them. They are being sold here in the form cigarettes, bathernuts, manpuri and many more. Also, within the friends circle they are used ^{openly}, with one friend usually forcing others to join him. This friendly consumption of drugs initially seen as fun and activities of mature people; later become strong addictions and haunt these individuals if they do not do it. This does not limit only to close circles but also is true for peer groups within schools, colleges, universities, and public and private networks. where one addict guy destroys his whole group, as the saying goes 'one bad fish destroys the whole pond'. In conclusion, this availability and accessibility of drugs have increased its addiction within the youth.

In addition to that, one other reason for increased drug addiction within the youth is, its increased appearances on media. Media has picturized drugs and drug addict people as cool and belonging to the new generation. Today, a number of dramas, films and series are being made on drugs. One such
