1- **Spiritual Equality:** Both Men and Women are equal in the eyes of Allah. They are superior only on the basis of good character and piety. Allah will increase their ranks on the

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Day of Judgement who are pious and fulfilled the teachings of Quran and Sunnah and ~~moderately~~, who is best in character.

### The Pious Saint of Basrah: Rabi'ah:

Rabi'ah, the pious saint of Basrah is known for his true deep spirituality and love for Allah. She devoted her life in the remembrance of Allah.

She said:

"O Allah, if I worship You, for the fear of hell, then burn me in fire. ~~But~~ And if I worship You for the hope of paradise, exclude me from Paradise. But if I worship You for You sake alone, do not deny me Your eternal Beauty."

This shows that deep Muhabbat (love) rooted in pure devotion. Islam is equal for both Men and Women.

### Society Perspective:

A woman is judged on the ~~basis of~~ her looks, body, and beauty. On Social Media and Society, mainly focus on her appearance ~~not spirituality~~.

If a woman covers herself or wears hijab, the society labeled herself as "Oppressed", or "Radical". Most of the

Islamic scholars are male or the safe society often thinks males and females are not spiritually equal. Beyond that Islam teaches that male & Men and Women are equal in the eyes of Allah.

2- **Financial Rights:** Islam gave women financial rights such as:

- 1- A women can own a business. She can earn money.
- 2- She has the right to inherit from her parents and husband.
- 3- She has the right to get (mahr) which was given by the husband, and which is her personal money.

In Quran: *... So give them those whom you marry their Mahr with good heart ...* (Surah An-Nisa)

**Hazrat Khadijah (R.A) as a business women:**

Hazrat Khadijah (R.A) the wife of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.W) was a great business woman. She is the true example that a women can earn money, if she wants to. Hazrat Khadijah (R.A) also helped

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Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.W) financially to spread Islam.

A women is not forced to spent her money for household. It is the duty of man. But if she wants to help her husband to lower his financial burden, so she can help him.

In Quran:

"For men is a share of what

they earn, and for women

is a share of what they earn..."

(~Surah - An - Nisa)

3- Status of Women as Daugter:

Before Islam, when people buried them alive. They feel daughter as burden, there is no respect for women. Even though women's are not given equal basic rights, Islam came and changed that thinking completely.

A Father should raise them with kindness

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on the Day of Judgement, Allah will surely increase their ranks.

### Society Perspective

In today's world especially in Pakistan daughters are felt as burden, they do prefer son over daughter. In our society, the daughter rights in inheritance is still not given to them in such places. Some of them kill daughter before the birth through abortion. However, there is no difference between the people of Makkah, how they treated daughter before Islam or today's world.

### Hayrat Muhammad (S.A.W.W) relation

#### with Hayrat Fatimah (R.A):

Whenever Hayrat Fatimah (R.A) came into the room of Holy Prophet (S.A.W.W)

He used to:

① He stand and greet her.

② Kiss her forehead.

③ Seat her in his own place.

### 4- Status of Women as wife:

③ And always treated her with love and kindness.

**Society Perspective:-**

A wife is treated as a property or a slave. Although they do violence on their wife. 1 out of 3 women cases are reported of domestic violence. Or they kill their wife. 80% women are struggling and expect her to stay silent and protect their home.

## 5- Status of Women as Mothers:

**Hadith:**

**"Paradise lies under the feet of mothers"**

Allah created a highest rank of women as mothers. Islam gives respect and rights to women.

Once a person came to Holy Prophet (S.A.W.W) and asked that I want to go for Jihad (Battle for Allah).

**The Prophet (S.A.W.W) asked:**

**"Is your mother alive?"**

**Person replied:**

**"Yes!"**

**The Prophet (S.A.W.W) said:**

**"Go back, and stay with your mother this is your jihad"**

The Prophet (S.A.W.W) taught serving your mother at home will be more rewarding than jihad.

**Society Perspective:**

Today, when the mother gets old, she becomes burden to their child. So they sent her to old homes. It is the dark reality of today's world.

The Ummah has neglected the teachings of Islam, even they raise their voice in front of their mothers. They are various examples in Islam, which shows that how Allah pleased

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their ranks, who treat their mothers with love and respect for instance Saad ibn Wagaa (R.A) was a loyal

## 6- Education Rights:

Hadith:

"It is obligatory for every man and women to seek Knowledge"

There is no compulsion of women education in Islam. Even Islam it is the duty of a Muslim to seek knowledge. The first word of Quran is "Iqra" which means "to read"

In Quran

"Read in the name of your Lord who created you..." (Surah Al-Alaq)

Hazrat Ayesha (R.A) wife of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.W) was the most knowledgeable people of that time.

She taught men and women about Islam, medicine and law. It shows that women can get education or lead as teachers, scholars etc.

Society Perspective:-

Society has mixed cultural practices with Islam. or forget the actual teachings of Islam. 129 million women are drop out of education. they usually spent money or prefer

education rather than women education

### 7- Legal and Political Rights:

Islam give right to women to lead as a leader, justice, speak in public and can make decision.

**Women collect Hazrat Umer (R.A).**

Hazrat Umer (R.A) suggested to limit the (mahr). A women corrected him and by using a verse he accepted it.

**(The women is right, Umer is wrong)**

### Society Perspectives:-

Today, women are still under-represented in courts and parliament, even in developed countries. Islam allows women to participate and lead with respect.

### 8- Modesty and Hijab as safety & Protection:

**In Quran:**

**“Tell believing women to lower their gaze and wear veils...”**

Allah tells women to dress modestly, cover her body, don't reveal beauty publically. Islam does not restrict women she can earn, gets education but to cover herself, protecting inner

inner and outer ~~beauty~~: purity  
 In Islam, women are protected  
 from rape, harassment, violence  
 and public shame. Hurting a woman  
 is a big sin.

**Hadith:**

**"Fear Allah in matters of women"**

Hazrat Muhammad (S.A.W.W) people  
 who mistreat women will be  
 punished.

**Conclusion:-**

Islam gave women complete honour,  
 respect, equal rights, even when  
 world treat them badly. Islam  
 sees men and women equal in  
 the eyes of Allah. Islam does not
