As George Orwell wrote in 1984, "War is Peace, Freedom is Slavery, Ignorance is strength" - words that ~~seem~~ to describe United States foreign policy. Despite its repeated claims of promoting democracy, human rights, and freedom, the United States has often waged wars in name of democracy, contributing to global instability. After World War II, the United States military interventions significantly increased. According to Uppsala University in Sweden, the US participated in 201 out of 248 armed conflicts between 1945 and 2001 - particularly in Korea, Japan, Iraq, Afghanistan, and Libya.

Moreover, these methods of interventions are not limited to direct warfare, she is engaged in proxy wars, regime-change operations, arms supply. Such actions have far-reaching consequences, including humanitarian crisis, prolonged wars, forced regime change, and the weakening

of global institutions and international laws

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This model of unilateralism is now being challenged by the growing strategic partnership between China and Russia, which advocates for a multipolar world order based on sovereignty, mutual respect, and non-intervention. In 2022, both countries issued a joint declaration condemning the Western-style Liberal democracy, instead or called for "democracy with Local traditions and characteristics". Even more alarming is the fact that the US withdrawal from key climate agreements, such as the Paris accord, under Trump. Both China and Russia criticize the US "green protectionism" - accusing her of using climate policies as trade barriers. In contrast, they prioritize development goals such as poverty reduction, climate action as the true human rights.
