UK is the one and only country in the world which has almost 90% unwritten constitutions. The system of the state is being run by some part of written part like Magna Carta (1215), Bill of Rights, Petition of Rights and other documents, conventions and other elements are judicial judgements, moral values and commentaries of critics.

→ Parliamentary Form of Government.
UK political system does

of government.

→ Parliament is Supreme.
