Unseen consequence of war is its impact on mental health. People are scared and stressed not only during the conflict but long after it ends. Civilians living in war zone experience constant fear, anxiety and uncertainty. They lost their homes, loved ones, and the sense of security, leaving them emotionally weak. It's very difficult for the people to return to normal life. Soldiers suffer too, even if they survive the battlefield. Many return home with invisible wounds. They go through Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and depression. Children are deeply affected more than anyone. Growing up around violence, death, and destruction can cause life time trauma. The emotional damage they suffer can impact their ability to trust, learn or develop healthy relationships in

future. These psychological scars are often lifelong, passed on through generations. The true cost of war is not just in lives lost but in minds broken.

War is one of the worst disasters for any country. One of the biggest consequences of war is the refugee crisis. When war starts, families are forced to run away from their houses. They leave behind their jobs, homes, schools and sometimes their family members too. Adults lose their jobs and children stop going to school. People who once lived in peace are suddenly struggling to survive.

According to UNHCR, there were over 117 million forcibly displaced people worldwide by the end of 2024. Many refugees live in tents or in small shelters with poor life facilities.

clean water, food and medical care are not always available. Refugee are mostly not allowed to work legally, they depend on aid. The countries that host refugees also face challenges.

These countries may already be struggling with their own economic and social issues.

When large numbers of refugees arrive, it puts pressure on housing, schools, ~~and~~ hospitals, and jobs.

War not only harms humans but also deeply affects nature. Bombings, landmines, and military vehicles destroy forest. Animals are killed, ~~fle~~, or lose their natural habitats. As a result, the balance of the ecosystem is broken. During war, weapons and explosions release harmful gases and chemical into the air which cause air pollution. Soil becomes poisoned with heavy metals and

explosives making farming unsafe for years. Some weapons used in war are so dangerous that their effects last for generations. The US dropped atomic bombs on ~~Hiroshima~~ ~~Nagasaki~~ Hiroshima and Nagasaki during WW2. The blasts killed over 200,000 people, but the environmental damage continued for decades. Due to radiation the soil, air and water get poisoned. Many children born years later had birth defects. Even plants and animals were affected. Nuclear weapons not only kill people immediately but also leave behind long-lasting environmental damage.
