Dilemma in Pakistan:

- i. Rapidly growing population, on one hand, in need of basic necessities of life and incapacity of government to fulfill or manage them, on the other hand.
(World Bank Report, 2025)
- ii. Rising levels of illiteracy multiplying population and lack of space in public schools to accommodate it.
(25 m out of school children)
- iii. Rapidly increasing population requiring healthcare facilities *vs* inadequacy of doctors and healthcare sources.
(Per capita spending on healthcare)
- iv. Youth bulge and unemployment as a result of ticking population

and poor efficiency of economic sectors to employ.

(Pakistan Economic Survey 2023-2024)

v. Vulnerability of big strata of population to climate catastrophes vs infrastructural lapses to prevent damage.

(Successive floods in Pakistan)

vi. Need to upgrade the skills of growing population in the light of digital innovation and the paucity of digital technology in country.

(India vs Pakistan)

vii. Horizontal growth of human societies vs depletion of agricultural land and looming threat of food crisis.

(Growth of cities in Pakistan)

D. Root Causes of Policy Dilemma On Population Growth and Resource Allocation in Pakistan:

i. Political entanglements and carelessness on part of policy-makers towards population crisis and resource allocation.

(Political turmoil and short-term policies)

ii. Lack of consensus on societal level on the imprints of unplanned population growth.
