Hamik Bhabha's concept of nationalism underscores the nexus among ~~mythical, imagined~~ and material in the development of a national identity. Like ~~narratives, historical contingency and ethnic affiliations construct and shape nations~~. However, the resulting exclusionary identities remain averse to humanism from universal human experience to bridge between cultures emphasized by ancient philosophers. While advocating for inclusive citizenship, Al-Ghazali's work emphasizes on balancing between local identities and nationalism and universalism and particularism. Bhabha's work also advocates for global citizenship based on humanism. However, the rise of nationalism has stifled creativity and opposition. Like chameleon, nationalism can equate patriotism with xenophobia yet it is a hotchpotch of both positive and negative consequences. While nations promote inclusive schemes, their desire for hegemony manifests in violence, exposing democracy as facade. It also linked democracy with imperialism. Democracy promotes nationalism under the guise of equality. Imperialism cultivated nationalism while leaving people to strive for self-determination.
