Drug abuse is the use of psychoactive substances like heroin, hashish, marijuana, cocaine, amphetamines, crystal meth (ice), and prescription drugs like sedatives and painkillers. These active substances affect brain and release happy hormones like dopamine, serotonin that provide heavenly feeling to the users. The individual slowly becomes addicted to them, and their withdrawal produces symptoms, such as hallucinations, schizophrenia, depression, anxiety, altered behaviour, and insomnia. The administration of drugs may be oral or intravenous route (I/V). The I/V drug users can fall prey to harmful diseases like hepatitis and HIV. In Pakistan, alarming stats are present. According to United Nations office on Drug and Crime, as of 2024, over 6.7 million Pakistanis are drug users with nearly 70% of them are below 35 years age.

Before focusing on how drug abuse poses threat to country's future, some factors contributing to <sup>the</sup> rising cases of drug abuse in Pakistan are discussed. There are numerous causes of rising trend of drug abuse in Pakistan. Foremost cause is cheap and easy availability of <sup>the</sup> psychoactive drugs. Most of the drug mafias are working extensively across metropolitan cities, targeting <sup>the</sup> younger population to accomplish their vested gains. On the other hand, law enforcement agencies are still weak due to widespread corruption and rising culture of bribery. Alongside,



There is uncontrolled drug trafficking across Afghanistan-Balochistan border. This border is highly porous due to mountainous terrains and hard-to-cover area. Despite continuous military operations, this area is highly vulnerable to militancy, terrorism and drug trafficking. Additionally, pop culture and social media easily influence the younger generations. Hence, drug abuse is becoming common in educational institutions, universities and colleges. Most of the students ~~while~~ <sup>initially</sup> experimenting with these drugs for entertainment or under peer pressure use these drugs for fun. However, later on, they get addicted to these harmful substances to escape from academic pressure, unemployment or other daily life problems. Most of the traditional families lack awareness of <sup>significance of</sup> mental health or psychological trauma. Due to lack of emotional support, the youth of Pakistan get inclined towards these life-threatening drugs to get temporary relief. However, this inclination has far-reaching consequences on their individual lives as well as collective growth of the society.

The rising cases of drug abuse in Pakistan are a great concern because they ~~impact~~ heavily impact both psychological and physical health of the individual. re, it is almost impossible to withdraw these drugs. It is because withdrawal symptoms are even more dangerous - in which person <sup>completely</sup> loses his control. In addition to this, narcotics impact functioning of other organs inside the body, such as liver, kidney, bladder, and gastro-intestinal tract (GIT) etc. The routes of administration of these drugs may be oral, intra-muscular or intra-venous. The use of injections poses another threat of infection of blood-borne diseases like hepatitis B, C ; HIV or even auto-immune human deficiency syndrome (AIDS). Hence, these diseases heavily impact physical health of the <sup>drug</sup> users. When the youth involve in this addictive cycle of drugs, they hamper the future growth of the country. According to a report published in Dawn (2020), some Islamabad universities reported that almost 25-30% of their students are involved in drug abuse. Hence, rising cases of drug abuse in the younger generation of Pakistan significantly undermines future growth of the country.

Additionally, drug abuse impacts overall morality of the individual and is responsible for his ultimate alienation in the society. Under the influence of psychological substances, the person loses self-control and sensibility of traditional values and culture.
