"Vicious use of ad hominem"

Precis:

In British court of law, when defense attorney takes the floor, he is handed over a note advising him to abuse the case by practicing ad hominem. Lincoln, a young lawyer, won one of first jury cases by non-malicious use of ad hominem. His opponent made sound arguments against Lincoln which he diffused by diverting jury's attention to opponent's lack of knowledge of law as his shirt was buttoned up the back, rather than the front. Similarly ad hominem had been used for President Eisenhower's nomination of 1956 and Franklin Roosevelt, in 1944, against his government policy.

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
