institutional trust. The World Bank (2022) notes that women's leadership increases the probability of

According to UNesco, in Pakistan nearly 22% of girls do not complete primary education, limiting their social and economic opportunities. In Afghanistan, the closure of schools under Taliban rule has prevented thousands of girls

From acquiring basic knowledge and participating in society, lack of education remains a major barrier to women's empowerment and hindrance to national development. Hence, lack of women's education also leads to the concept of 'glass ceiling' in the workplace.

The concept of 'Glass ceiling' acts as the huge obstacle for women's empowerment, as women are often denied promotion beyond ~~certain~~ certain level, discouraging their participation in decision-making. In Pakistan, women in senior government positions often face promotion barriers despite qualifications, limiting their influence in policy-making. Globally, studies by World Economic Forum show that women hold less than 25% of senior leadership roles in corporations due to the glass ceiling. The glass ceiling significantly restricts women's empowerment and slows national development. Therefore, it is said that glass ceiling as well as male dominant society, both limits women's empowerment.

Male dominant society is the sole reason for women's exclusion as

men often control decision making both at home and in public spaces. Such social structure restricts women's choices, and opportunities, limiting their role in natural development. In many rural areas of Pakistan, men prevent women from pursuing education and employment, reducing female participation in the workforce. According to UNDP, reports, patriarchal norms across South Asia continue to confine women to unpaid domestic roles, weakening their economic inclusion. Male dominant society continues to obstruct women's inclusion and slows progress toward national development. Hence, a male dominant society not only limits women's role in decision making but also reinforce strict mobility restriction imposed upon them.

Mobility restrictions for women is the reason behind gender inequality, as limited freedom of movement reduces their access to education, employment, and social participation. When women are not allowed to commute freely, they miss out on professional and personal growth opportunities. In many parts of Pakistan, families prohibit women from travelling alone, preventing them from attending

school, universities, and workplaces. According to World Bank, restricted mobility is one of the top factors keeping South Asian women out of labour market. Restricted women not only limits women's choices but also weakens their confidence.
