- a) Failure of International law by its selective enforcement of weakens the credibility of global institutes.
(e.g., ICC's failed prosecution of Netanyahu in violation of international law)
- b) The war crimes and humanitarian crisis evading accountability are the crisis of ethics and morality.
(e.g., Israel's actions in Gaza)
- c) The violation of territorial integrity and sovereignty by states prioritizing national interests.
(e.g., Russian invasion of Ukraine)
- d) The economic exploitation of poorer countries through control of resources.

e) The increasing dependence of Global South on foreign assistance along with strict conditionalities burdenize them under debt trap.

(e.g., IMF assistance to Pakistan with higher interest rates)

(e.g., insufficient climate finances provision by global powers)

g) Global powers weaponizing economic sanctions disrupting the international political community.

(e.g., US sanctions on China)

h) States backing terrorism to achieve strategic objectives and supporting non-state actors to disrupt stability.

(e.g., India's indirect involvement in supporting TIP in Pakistan)

(e.g., UN's inaction on Israel conflict)

j) The West's agenda of controlling Asian economies for dominance through globalization undermines ethics and morality.

(e.g., Exploitation of Bangladesh's cheap labor and natural resources)

k) The proliferation of nuclear weapons use is creating security dilemma disrupting the global peace and stability.

(e.g., Russia's shift in nuclear doctrine)
