Someone rightfully said that "The greatest hurdle in bringing harmony amongst the individuals is the existing prevalence of discrimination". And there is

factually no lie in this, either.

Communities belonging to different races, castes, religions, belief systems, class, can come together and coexist peacefully.

But the innate superiority complex and persistent racial and gender discrimination has made that hard to achieve. Since

the start of time, men of all races, lived together: hunted for food and supplies and provided for their families.

Women brought up the children and tended to the house chores.

But what with industrialization and modernization, man got his hands on things that were a lot more luxurious and

comfortable than their day-to-day struggles. In the race for luxuries and modernity, people became greedy and developed a superiority complex on the basis of wealth, resources and colour. The "colored" part of the world struggled with manual labour and slavery a lot more as compared to the rest, and hence always looked down upon and considered inferior. Till date, the colored races are still not treated indifferently: rather, the biasness in jobs, opportunities and other fields is still very much evident. Additionally, the women suffer more as they are already considered the weaker and less-able gender. Naturally, it became double discrimination for them in every regard. Race and

If we look into the history, one thing is very clear: the Africans were always being marginalized. Africans, or "Black people" as they are often called, have struggled with racism and extremism for the longest time. They were treated as outcasts, or as people who were less capable than the rest. They were not given their due to human rights or even an access to sufficient resources for their survival. For example, during the 1950's and the 1960's, the Black community in the United States was

being targetted actively. At that time, mutual efforts were being made by the victimized community's activists to stir up a way out. In the midst of all this, Martin Luther King, an American civil rights activist, gave his famous speech "I have a dream". Martin's speech held such a profound weight and impact that it managed to help him advocate for Black people's rights amongst extreme violence and racism. This is because his speech entailed a vision of great harmony amongst people of races: where everyone gets their access to their due economic, social and civil rights. Where women and children of the targetted race are

safe and their men kept away from being victimized. Hence, racial or gender discrimination, as it can be seen, is not a modern-day issue but a rather deep-rooted ill in the society.

Similar to this, women have also been discriminated in regards to being given opportunities or getting their needs fulfilled. Many women are single mothers or in some cases, have an unemployed husband, which births the dire need for money.

But women of color and of a different race struggle alot more with getting their hands on to a secure job as they are often not paid sufficiently. Other than that, many of them are often deprived of their basic

This makes co-existing even harder.

Nelson Mandela, another Black social rights activist, spoke about this discrimination and went to great lengths to give the minority their due rights.

His impact was so immense, he still managed to sustain it even after he got imprisoned.

But this struggle for vocal and life-freedom highlights the lengths the Black community has went to in order to achieve a world without discrimination and any extremism. But all in vain.

In addition to this, as if racial discrimination was not doing enough, the women of colour were also being treated like an inferior. What with reduced

access to opportunities and resources, they were also being targeted for, first, being a woman, and second, for being a woman of colour.

The biggest example of this is the Rosa Parks incident where a black woman was asked by the bus driver to get up and give up her seat for a white woman. When she refused, the driver stopped the bus and ordered her to get off.

Another noteworthy point in this story is that at the time this story took place, the trend was that Black people were supposed to sit in the back of every public transport, leaving the front seats for the white or as they said, the "superior" race. This in itself depicts

the extent of discrimination that women, because their race and gender, had to deal with. This also strongly highlights the fact that the African community settled in foreign countries have been marginalized in various regards, as well as for the longest time.

But just like the Africans, a huge majority of the muslim community, settled outside of their home country, also get subjected to discrimination and in some cases, abuse.

The prevalence of Islamophobia, specially in the West, has made living hard for the muslim population settled there. The first and foremost thing is the misunderstood concept that

Although men are discriminated

Often judged for covering
their heads, or in some
cases, their faces, women
are kept out of many
discussions and opportunities from
fear of not being "liberal"
enough for the task. This
is mainly due to the
stigma the West has
attached to Muslim women

however they want to".
Even though there should be a freedom to dress however a person deems fit, that, sadly, is a concept still alien to the modern world.

Additionally, in several places around the world, there have been bans on the wearing of hijab and niqab for Muslim women.

France, for instance, has passed a law on the banning of covering of the heads or the faces, for the women.

University going female students are not allowed to sit in class in case they are covering either of the aforementioned places.

Muslim women were also being faced with sexist and extremist jokes if they were in their traditional attire.

Furthermore, muslim women were also being excluded from participating in sports and other championships, if they broke the law. A recent incident was reported where the French government banned the muslim women, who were in their semi-finals in an Olympic sport, from participating if they continued to do so with their heads or faces covered. This created a great unrest for the women as they weren't being given their due freedom to follow their beliefs and dress accordingly. Moreover, if any of the muslim women were caught breaking the law, they were captured and sent straight to jail. This extreme stance on a mere

clothing style is a point of concern for many and shows how women of color or South Asian and middle-Eastern women struggle for liberty and their due freedom to live.

Although women, irregardless of race, suffer too, it cannot be denied that women of colour suffer more. Prevalence of gender inequality, biasness, gender gap and concepts like glass ceiling show that we live in a society where women are less favored over men.
