

Girls' Education Conference in Islamabad

The government of Pakistan has recently conducted a conference on importance of girls education with the active collaboration of the Muslim World League (MWL). The conference was attended by the multiple renowned figures from Muslim world, great mufti of Egypt, Secretary General of MWL, and the noble laureate Malala Yousafzai.

The main theme of ~~the~~ conference was 'Importance of Girls Education in Muslim World: Opportunities and Challenges'. The Prime Minister of Pakistan gave an inaugural speech and stressed on need to take stringent measures to revive girls education in the Muslim world. The PM highlighted the prime significance of girls education in a society. He said, "Educating girls is not a privilege only; it is a fundamental right of every individual including girls, which ensure the advancement of a society." Malala Yousafzai also addressed the conference and stressed the need of global intervention in this regard. She blamed incumbent Taliban regime of barring girls from getting education. He showed utter disappointment over increasing gap between male and female education in the Muslim world.
