In aforementioned statement, Quaid-i-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah said in a reply to civic address presented by Quetta Municipality on June 15, 1948 that national integration is an important factor for any country's economy. He strongly advocated the national integration in the country because he was conscious of the benefits of diverse communities. Similarly, democracy is a tool through which one can promote the cause of national integration by giving them equal opportunities in every sphere of the country irrespective of their caste, religion, language, and culture. Is democracy not giving the representation of diverse groups? Can we say that democracy gives them right to say in policy making? Is democracy not protecting

minority rights? Can we say that democracy allows diverse groups to build national identity?

Corruption has become the evil of our society in which certain groups or factions fill their pockets. Not only this, but there is no one who makes them accountable owing to poor governance. As a result, the affected communities consider themselves as a separate region. For instance,

The people of Balochistan consider themselves as separate due to lack of good governance and corruption because their resources are being ignored. Thus, it does not allow democracy to function properly in enhancing national integration.

Lastly, weak institutions are also playing an important role in containing democracy to promote national integration. These are various institutions which do not perform well, like Judiciary. In a democratic process, Judiciary plays an important role to maintain checks and balances so that all institutions work properly, but Judiciary often faces problems, such as political interventions and military interference. These forces do not allow Judiciary to work on the basis of transparency. As a result, the rights of marginalized groups are often ignored and denied owing to lack of accountability. This not only affects the Judiciary, but it also creates sense of disintegration.

In order to deal with these issues, there is a dire need to opt adopt some preventive measures to rule out these challenges. One of the most important solution is to enhance

anti-corruption measures. It is not possible to promote national integration unless there is a element of corruption. By implementing such measures which make the official accountable, like check and balance, digital calculations, and enhancing awareness regarding the corruption, the country can downsize the corruption. Therefore, it will promote sense of equality and equity among various factions.

Apart from this, political stability is another solution. This will enhance national integration by making long-term policies. If there is a political stability in the country, the government will mull over other issues like national integration, equal rights, transparency and meritocracy. **Ishrat Hussain writes in his book 'Governing the Ungovernable' that political stability plays vital role in promoting national integration.**

Therefore, it is necessary for the government to implement some policies which promotes political stability for the sake of national integration.

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Additionally, promoting national dialogue is also essential. It is necessary for the government to call in all parties together and promote national dialogue in which they all agree to promote national integration, regardless of their culture, language, religion, and regionalism. Nelson Mandela also emphasized that national dialogue is essential so that all marginalized groups can participate. Hence, it is necessary to promote national dialogue so that the country moves smoothly on the path of democracy where all groups and communities are equal.
