## Socially Constructed Systemic Inequalities

Social stratification is a system that reflects social inequalities in a broader sense. It relates to systemic inequalities conducted on the basis of race, class etc. Individual social standing relates to broader societal structure.

Determinants of stratification vary across societies on the basis of wealth, wisdom, age, or occupation. These beliefs are embedded by culture or socially constructed through parental training. Social ranking classifies as an individual's identity.

Occupations like teaching are considered noble but paid less while businessmen are viewed differently due to their profit driven attitude. Thus, cultural norms exacerbate social inequalities.
