F INTRODUCTION:-


The waves of feminism emerged in response to discrimination and injustice faced by women in every sector of life. The first wave emerged with emphasis on political rights of women.

The succeeding wave expanded the scope with addressing the socio-economic challenges of women. The last major wave focused on expanding the members and remaining inclusive. Each wave emerged with addressing challenges of previous wave. In Pakistan, women faced heavy discrimination in socio-economic sectors. This can be elevated by 2nd wave, whose focus is primarily on enhancing the socio-economic status of women.

Feminism is a range of movements and ideologies that share a common goal. That is to define, establish, and achieve equal political, economic, cultural, personal and social rights for women.


Feminism has been divided into three waves


1700s → dates back to french Revolution




III.C. Success achieved through it

This wave focused much on political aspect of 'right to vote'. The movement has been quite successful in achieving this goal. In U.S., 19th amendment was passed in 1920 which granted women right to vote. Similarly, the success reached to Euro other parts of west.

In U.K., representation of people act 1918 granted women, over age of 30, right to vote. These are the most prominent



The second wave of feminism was focused more on women liberation. It's focus was to change the structure of society, coinciding with radical feminism. The focus has expanded from political to social domains. Women liberation and consciousness raising groups were central to this wave of feminism. Many obvious issues have been recognised like health issue, violence, harassment etc. Activism was carried out in full bloom. In 1969, a protest was carried out to show that women ~~to~~ were paraded like cattle. This protest was carried out close to a pageant. Key contributors were as follows.




IV.C

outlawed the gender discrimination. women were also provided with liberty in personal life, through reproductive rights and increased sexual autonomy.




IV. 3rd wave of feminism:

V.B Objectives and focus:


