To begin with, the financial obligations tied to the CPEC can strain regional economy. The debt burden on Pakistan due to this project has increased significantly. The country has secured significant loans from international monetary institutions leading to fear of a debt trap in the country. In the ²⁰²⁰ report of IMF on Pakistan's issues analyzed that the country's external debt has risen significantly due to the infrastructure projects related to CPEC. The fund suggested that Pakistan should carefully manage its funds in order to

avoid potential economic crisis as this would impact its bilateral agreements with other countries and exacerbate regional tensions. Thus, CPEC can impact regional economies.

Similarly, the projects associated with CPEC can fuel geo-political tensions in the region due to increased Chinese influence. The route of CPEC follows from Gilgit-Baltistan, crossing KPK, ^{Sindh} and PATA ending in the province of Balochistan. This demonstrates that the route of CPEC is home to different sects and ethnicities. The increased intervention of Chinese in these regions threatens the external as well as internal peace in Pakistan. This can be illustrated by the Baloch Liberation Army's (BLA) protest on the CPEC's route passing through the province of Balochistan in October 2024. They demanded ^{the} Chinese workers to be removed from the territory. The protest raised tensions in the region. Thus, CPEC can exacerbate geo-political tensions.

Subsequently, the large-scale projects associated with CPEC lead to the degradation of the environment. The main focus of CPEC is to enable global trade and boosting industrialization in the ~~region~~ Pak-China region. The numerous projects it is working towards include: coal-based power plants in Sahiwal, copper-gold mining at Quadate, M-5 motorway, Special Economic Zones (SEZs) etc. These projects involve heavy deforestation, burning of fossil fuels, disruptions in marine habitats and much more. All these associated impacts ~~settle~~ in disturb the natural ecosystems and add to the climate crisis. According to NDMA, the deforestation due to CPEC projects has increased the overall deforestation in the country by at least 3 percent. Thus, CPEC projects exacerbate environmental damage.
