It is not ungenerous and superficial to blame our educational system. It is true, as educators such as Bernard Iddings Bell have pointed out, that on the whole our primary schools no longer really teach the child certain basic skills---how to read, write, speak, listen, and figure---the non possession of which works against the development of attention. It is true, as Bell says that many of our primary schools, through the system of mass-promotion place a premium on mental laziness. It is true also that many of our high schools proceed on the make-the-work-interesting to the student theory which hardly conduces to the development of the intellect. Finally, it is true that the college, therefore, is forced to neglect its true function --- which is to produce mentally mature leaders --- in favour of performing belatedly and therefor, inefficiently, the clementary educational duties that are properly the province of the primary and secondary schools.
