3a National Climate change policy revisions.

Pakistan Climate Change Ministry (2024) launched a revised National climate policy focused on resilience and green energy. (2024)

3b Ten Billion Tree Tsunami initiative.

WWF (2025) praised Pakistan's plantation of 1.7 billion trees, reducing carbon footprint.

3c: Provincial disaster preparedness

NDMA (2024) conducted mock drills in 12 flood-prone districts to enhance local preparedness.

IMF (March 2025) noted Pakistan

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allocated PKR 400 billion to green projects in its fiscal plan.
