(b) Building trust through integrity

He was known as Al-Ameen (The Trustworthy) even by enemies, trust is a pillar. If nations uphold honesty in diplomacy, it fosters long term peace.

In Quran Allah says:
Indeed Allah commands you to render trust to whom they are due and when you judge between people to judge with Justice. (Nisa)

(c) Forgiveness and reconciliation

After the conquest of Makkah, the Prophet (ﷺ) forgave his bitterest enemies, including those who persecuted him for years. This act of reconciliation united Makkah under Islam without bloodshed. This lesson shows that nations could adopt permanent peace accordingly.

In Quran Allah says,
Let them pardon and forgive.
Do you not love that Allah should
forgive you? (Al-An-Nur)

(d) Justice as a foundation of peace :

He upheld justice even against his own followers. In the case of women from a noble tribe committing theft, the Prophet (ﷺ) rejected intercession and said, "Even if Fatima, daughter of Muhammad (ﷺ) stole, I would cut off her hand." Peace is impossible without justice.
