* Introduction:-

- ⇒ The conflict between Russia and Ukraine ^{started} in 2014 and has affected the safety and peace of the whole region
- ⇒ The conflict began due to territorial disputes (land disagreements) and longstanding political tensions b/w the two countries.
- ⇒ Ukraine, once part of the Soviet Union, now wants to be closer to western countries like the EU and NATO.
- ⇒ Russia sees this move as a threat to its own power and influence in the region.

Crimea and Eastern Ukraine

- ⇒ In 2014, Russia took control of Crimea (a region that was part of Ukraine.)
- ⇒ Around the same time, fighting started in eastern Ukraine b/w Ukrainian forces and Russia-backed groups.
- ⇒ These two events made the war worse and longer.

Ukrainian People's View

- Many Ukrainians want more freedom and stronger ties with Western Countries.
- This desire has caused more tensions with Russia, which wants to keep Ukraine under its influence.

* Impact on Pakistan's National Security

- The conflict affects Pakistan because it is close to both China (Russia's partner) and India (Ukraine's ally).
- Pakistan shares borders with both India and Afghanistan, so any instability in the region could impact Pakistan's security.

* Security threats to Pakistan
