Evidence: Napoleon waged endless wars to expand his empire.
- viii) Despite mass protests, rulers continue aggressive wars to expand territory;
Evidence: Israel waging war crimes in Gaza, despite global condemnation.
- ix) Despite low investment, leaders restrict ease of doing business to protect their financial interests;
Evidence: Instead of facilitating business, recent Pakistan's government issues loans to maintain control.
- x) Despite unemployment, leaders use patronage-based recruitment, causing desperation in society;

Evidence: In higher posts often depend on political connections rather than merit.

- xi) Deterioration of governance institutions as rulers manipulate them for personal gains;

Evidence: In Sheikh Hasina's government institutions serve the interests of those in power rather than public.

- xii) Despite poor economic growth, governments enact reforms favoring relatives businesses;

Evidence: In Pakistan, leaders tailor policies to benefit family enterprises.
