

Q1. What is the concept of Islam?

Tawhid (Oneness of Allah):-

The basic foundation of Islam is the unity or oneness of Allah is known as Tawhid. This unity expressed in the kalima i.e. 'La ilah ill Allah'.

Tawhid means that there is one, Supreme Lord of the Universe, who is the creator, cherisher and sustainer of heaven and earth, man and animal.

Life after death:-

Belief in life after death which means to the judgement, bodily resurrection, heaven and hell, is the basic principle of the Islam. According to Quran, whoever believes in Allah and the last day and does right and good deeds shall have their reward with their lord, on the day of judgement - (2:62)

Islam is a Complete way of life:-

Islam is not a religion in the common, distorted meaning of the word, confining its scope to the private life of man.

It is a complete way of life, catering for all the fields of human existence.

Islam provide guidance throughout the life. Its impact on individual and social, material, moral, economic, political, legal, cultural, national and international.

## Unity of Matter and Spirit:

A unique feature of Islam is that it does not divided life into water-tight situation which compartments of matter and spirit. It holds that Spiritual elevation is to be done by living to believe in God in every situation. As Quran says, Our Lord Gave us the good in this world and the good in the hereafter -(2:201).
