### A) Introduction:

Evidence: Emerging economies like China aims to reduce western influence and maintain own's global influence.

viii) Citizens hoping their governments to implement reforms in poor socio-economic conditions;

Evidence: The Arab spring (2010-2012) was fueled by citizens' hope for political and economic reforms in Tunisia & Egypt.

ix) Successful movements led by laborers were propelled by hope for fairness and dignity;

Evidence: The U.S. labor strikes fought

and won better working conditions  
and rights.

x) Enhancing the chances of mental  
and physical health recovery.

Evidence: Studies shows that patients  
with high hopes tend to recover  
faster from illness.

xi) Acting as a driving force for  
innovation and progress;

Evidence: The space race was driven by  
hope for scientific advancement culmi-  
nating into the Apollo 11 moon landing  
in 1969.

xii) Ordinary citizen defeating empires  
with high morals and hope in the  
history;

Evidence: Napoleon becoming emperor  
by defeating many territories in  
history.
