revenues from productive investment,

by cutting public spending

by pressuring to adopt policies
that benefits creditors at expense
of public.

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2.4, Enhances resources exploitation due to countries under high debt forced to extract natural resources to generate revenue to service their debt

2.5, leads to exposure to change rate risk by increasing country's vulnerability to currency fluctuation.

2.1 A weak legal framework
creates challenge for developing
countries to control cybercrime
due to lack of specific laws
than presence of specific laws

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2.2 Limited resources and investment leads to weak infrastructure than strong infrastructure.

2.3 Digital and skill gap in developing countries leaves population vulnerable to attacks and hinders development of skilled cybersecurity workforces

2.4 Lack of international cooperation hinders ability to share intelligence and coordinate investigation than strong cooperation
