(a) The government should collaborate with international education institutions for ensuring quality education for women.

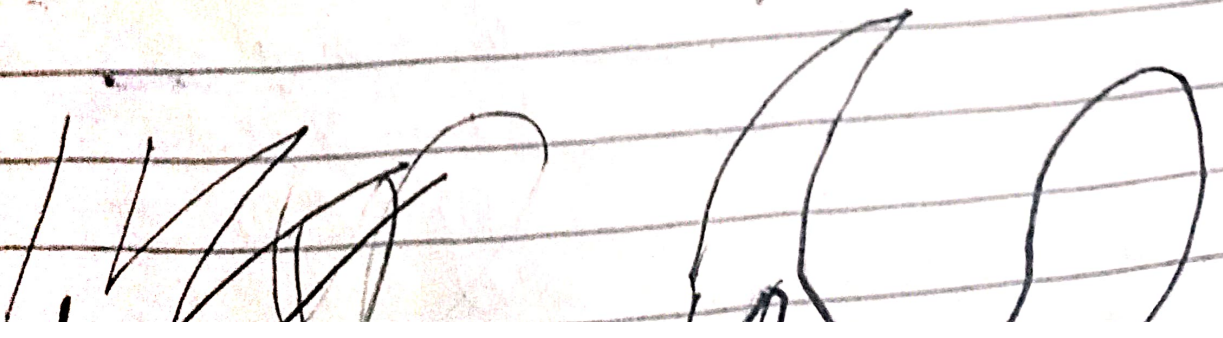
⑥ Adequate infrastructure should be developed for women universities as an agent of change.
