3. Changes family and marriage dynamics

a. Promotes shared responsibilities

b. Raises awareness about ills of child marriages.

4. Changes Men's attitude toward women

a. Educated men treat women like an equal not subordinate

b. "With gun you can kill terrorists, with education you can kill terrorism" (Malala Yousufzai)

5. Promotion of peace and Tolerance

a. Educated mother nurture their children in a better way.

b. "Educating girl is not only an investment in women but also in peace and security."
(UNESCO, Report)

6. Raises Awareness about Legal and Political Rights.

a. It empowers women to advocate for change

b. "Development and Democracy, enhanced by gender equality, are key ingredients of a just society." (Amartya Sen)

7. Enhances Positive Attitudes from Clergies.

a. Educated clergies will promote awareness about role of women in Islamic history.

b. "Women have rights similar to those of men equitably" (Al-Baqarah Quran)

8. Raises awareness at Parental level about the Girl Child.

a. Promotes equal treatment with sons and daughters.

b. Encourages parents to support their daughters in their hobbies and career opportunities.
