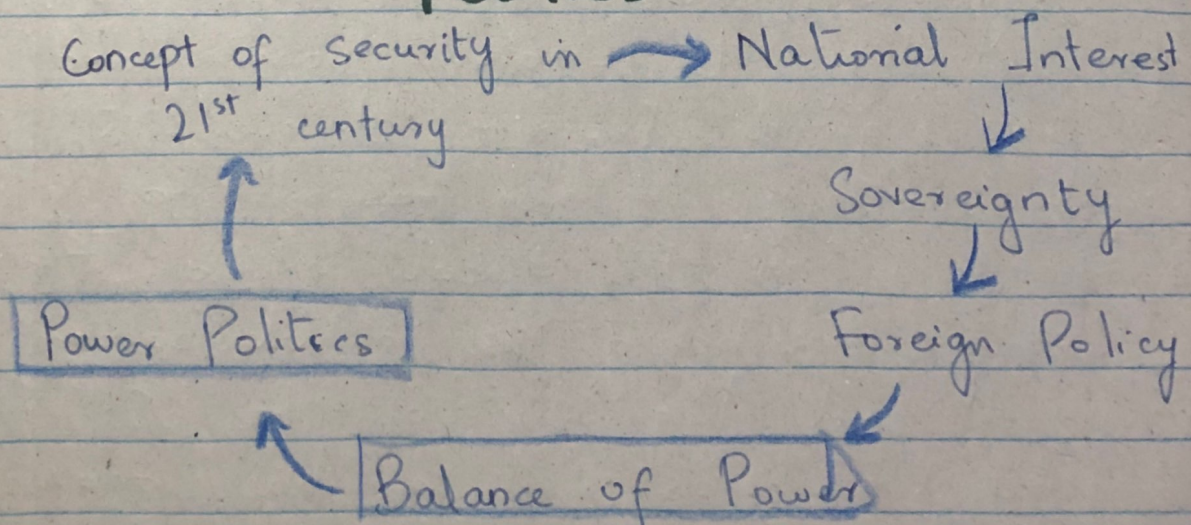
III) SECURING STATES SOVEREIGNTY:
