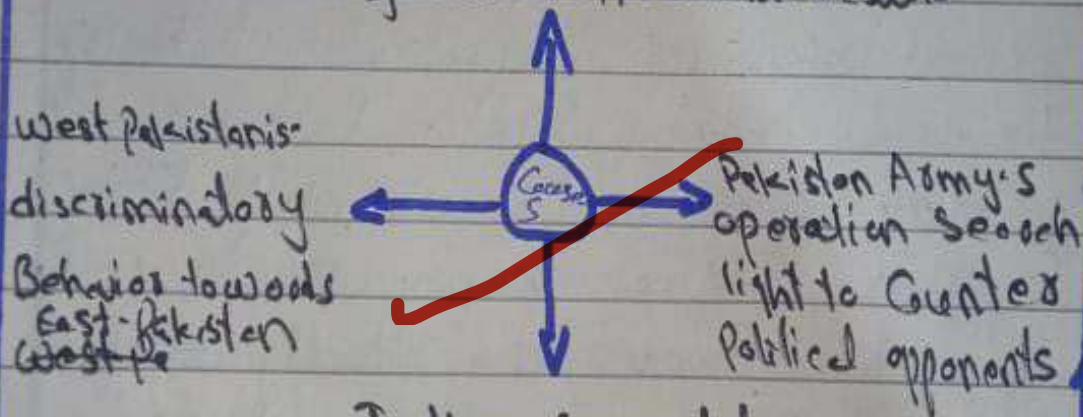
Introduction

The fall of Dacca or Separation of East Pakistan has always remained one of the darkest chapters in Pakistan's History. There are multiple factors responsible for this tragedy like conflict over the results of 1971 elections, the West Pakistan's discriminatory behavior towards East Pakistan, launching of Military operation "The Search light" to suppress political opponents and the involvement and finally invasion of East Pakistan by Indian Armed forces. Accompanied by the aforementioned factors, the fall of Dacca took place resulting in the surrender of Pakistan Army and Separation of Majority from minority. In this tragic event global and regional powers also equally participated like USSR undecisively sided with India while America

One of the very first causes of the conflict was the Pakistan Peoples

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Partly's rejection of election results of 1971 as Sheikh Mujib ur Rahman had won the election and he was supposed to be government. However, the white-looking West Pakistani did not want that they should be ruled by a lesser ~~two~~ East Pakistani; therefore they tried to delay the process. This attitude sparked anger among the Bengalis and ultimately many of them migrated to India and many began protesting against this injustice.

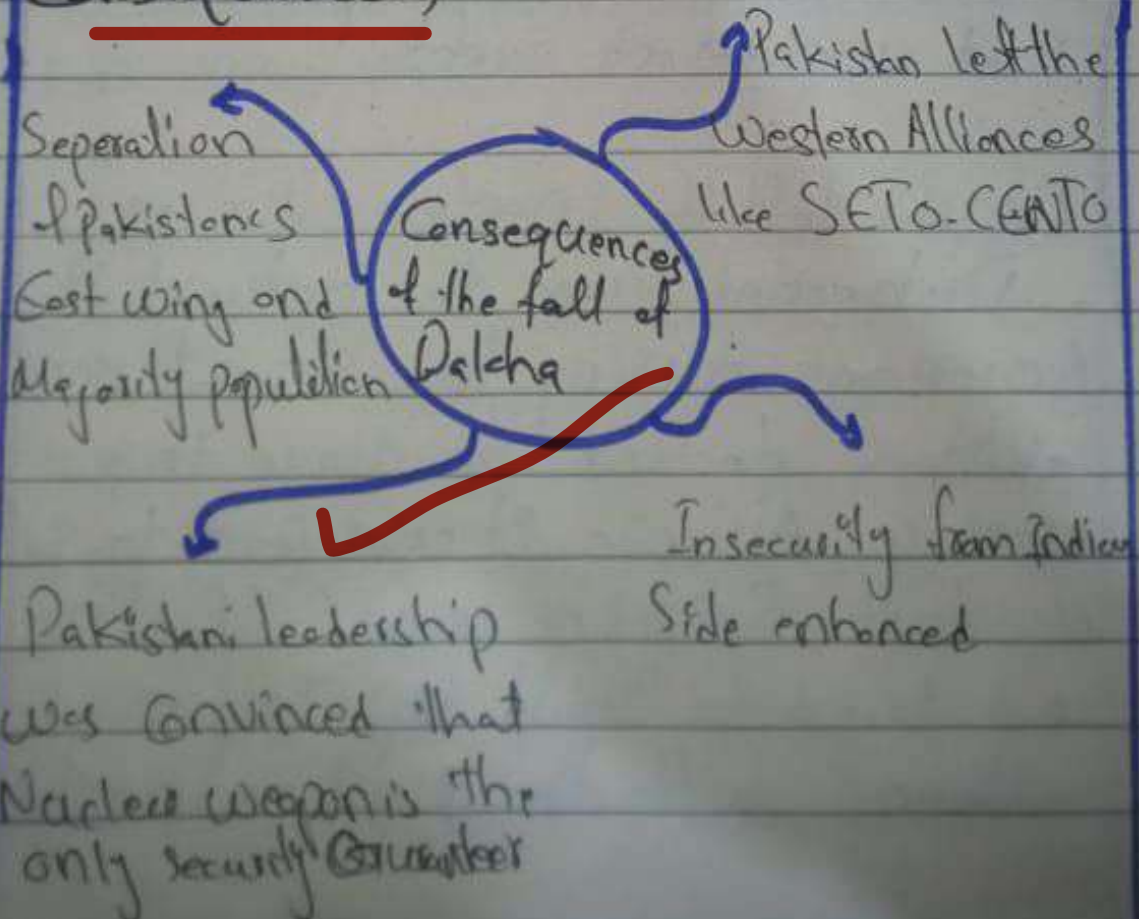
Indian Invasion of East Pakistan

Thus, this ultimately resulted in the defeat and Surrender of Pakistan Army and Separation of East Pakistan.

Dacca and East Pakistan were very crucial for united Pakistan as it was the City of Dacca where All India Muslim League was formed. Thus Dacca was very important component for Quaid-e-Azam's Pakistan which, unfortunately, separated in that unpleasant event.

Pakistan left its Western Alliances Disheartened from the betrayal of Americans during the war of 1971. Pakistan decided to leave the Western Alliance it was part to. So it left SEATO and CENTO and tried to build up regional alliances with the Muslim world.

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This decision led Pakistan to regionalize its relations and join Non-Aligned Movement.

As Pakistan was in Western Camp, so US promised to support Pakistan in the crisis. However, when Indian Navy with Soviet backing blocked Pakistan's way in Bay of Bengal to rest Pakistan the American support never came for Pakistan's assistance which ultimately contributed to Pakistan's defeat in the war of 1971 due to

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blockade of Supplies. Other than this, Gulf States warmly supported Pakistan diplomatically. Similarly, other Western States like UK & France did diplomatic support but none of them supported Pakistan in Military or material terms.

CPEC or China Pakistan Economic Corridor is a project under China's Belt and Road Initiative. CPEC project has the potential to transform Pakistan's every sector be that energy sector, industry, transportation and export sector, as it is a multi-dimensional project that involves building infrastructure for energy sources, transportation and export import. However, there are some concerning threats to this project. There are hostile countries who are waging proxy wars against CPEC and also propagating a negative image of CPEC.

(1) Infrastructure Development and Connectivity

For Pakistan, the underdeveloped infrastructure has always been a problem be that energy infrastructure

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or transportation infrastructure. According to World Bank's report on energy, annually 16% of Pakistan's electricity is wasted due to flawed energy infrastructure lines. Similarly on transportation side, Pakistan's resource rich regions, like Balochistan and KPK do not have good roads to ensure smooth transportations. Thus, CPEC is the remedy of this. Under CPEC, Chinese Companies are supposed to build electricity grids, roads and railway network to ensure smooth transportation. This will connect Pakistan's provinces internally as well as externally with the regional states.

It CPEC will boost Pakistan's exports as it connects Pakistan internally and externally.

As one of the key agendas of CPEC is Connectivity, so if it does connect Pakistan with markets of Central Asia, Middle East, and Africa, and Europe, then it will

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will greatly boost its economy

Pakistan's two provinces Balochistan and KPK have always remained unstable and with the initiation of CPEC projects, the Militants doubled their attacks. For instance, last in March the Chinese engineers, working on Dasu Dam project, were hit through a suicide attack that resulted the death of 5 Chinese officials. Similarly, in Balochistan in 2024 CPEC Authority Port Complex was attacked by the proscribed militant group BLA which also caused loss of lives. That's why active militancy in these two provinces is a grave challenge to CPEC.

2) Western propaganda against CPEC

Besides proxy war against CPEC the western states are also active

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active in negative propaganda against CPEC like they term CPEC a debt trap which, according to western media, China uses to grab territories and use them for exploitation and military purposes. Thus, this is also a challenge CPEC faces.

3) Indian propaganda and claim on CPEC being built on a disputed territory of Gilgit Baltistan

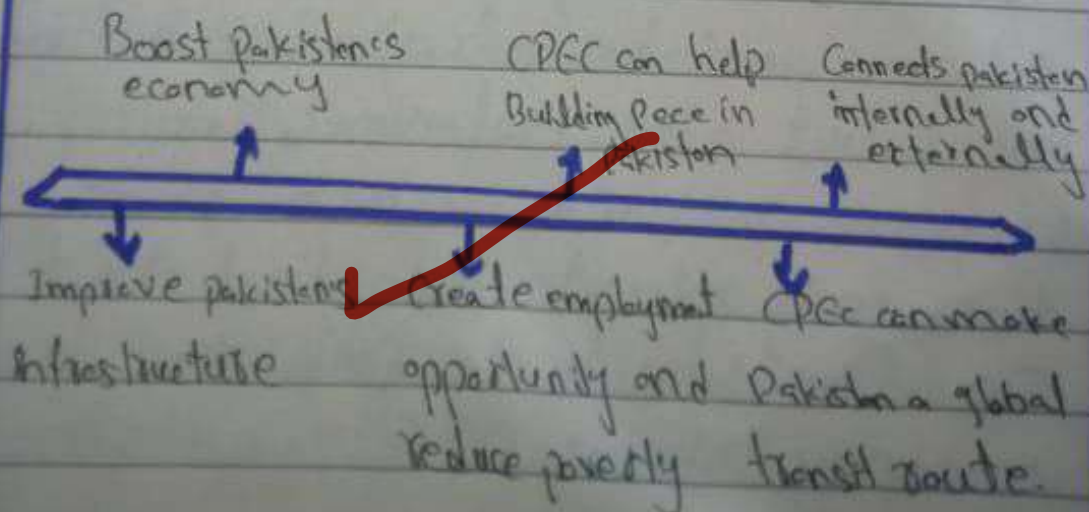
Though the original MAP of BRI project mentioned India as a participating country, but India not only rejected this proposal of participation, but also blamed China for building CPEC on a disputed territory of Gilgit Baltistan. However, Pakistan and China both promptly rejected India's this allegation and pursued CPEC as planned, but India still keeps proclaiming CPEC an illegal pro-

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ject. Thus, this is also a challenge to CPEC's legitimacy.

Western and Indian projects to Counter CPEC with waging proxy war, a media campaign and diplomatic war against CPEC and BRI, the western and Indian opponents are active in producing new projects to Counter China's projects. In this regard India Middle East, Europe & Corridor IMEC is an example which was launched to Counter CPEC. However, any such project is far behind from competing with CPEC.
