### Introduction:-

Robert K. Martin's theory states that individual commit crimes due to the societal pressure. According to Martin's Strain theory, the one some socially accepted goals, like a high pay job, a successful business and so on. For achieving the socially accepted goals, there are socially approved means that an individual is supposed to follow for achieving these goals. However, Martin says that there are limited resources and every one does not have the means to achieve these goals, so he states that then individual adopts other illegal means to achieve that goals like robbery, Murder etc.

According to Martin there are five types of people and their responses to this societal strain which are as:

Conformity	Goal	Means
1) Conformity	Accepts Socially accepted goals.	Try to achieve those goals with socially approved means.
2) Innovation	The individual accepts Socially accepted goals.	But adopt other means to achieve those goals
3) Ritualist	A person does not accept the Socially accepted goals but follows them.	Accepts the Socially accepted means.
4) Retardist	Does not accept Socially accepted goals	Does not accept Socially approved means.
5) Rebellion	Rejects goal create his own goals.	Rejects means create own means

### R.K. Merton's Model

Conformity:

It is when a individual has the required means to achieve the Socially accepted goals.

for example, a person has money to start a business, then he does not need to indulge in any sort of crime as he can achieve those socially accepted goals through legal means.

(2) Innovations:

In Contrary to Conformity when an individual wants to achieve the required goals socially accepted, but does not have resources or means to achieve them. In this situation, the strained person try to achieve these socially accepted goals through other means like if he wants to open a shop, but he does not have money, then he chooses to do a robbery to open a shop. This, according to Martin, is innovation. When individual uses socially unapproved means to achieve socially accepted goals.

### (3) Ritualistic:

The third response is of a person who is convinced that he or she cannot achieve the socially accepted goals, but continues to follow the socially approved means like going to office and passing days.

### (4) RetreadWist:

It is when an individual neither accepts the socially accepted goals nor the means. This is an example of a person who is cut off from the society like a drug addict who has nothing to do with achieving socially accepted goals and means.

### (5) Rebellion:

Now, this a situation when a individual does not accept the societal structure, the goals and means. Therefore, that person rejects these both and try to change

those Socially accepted goals.


3) Promote Deviant Behavior in the Society.

(4) This strain excludes unsuccessful individuals and push them toward Criminally.

When a Society having certain Goals and Means and pressurize individuals to achieve them, so when an individual cannot achieve those goals, so he and she is out of that grouping or Club. Postentially, this social exclusion can lead to increase in chance that that individual will adopt a deviant behavior and Commit Crime.

(5) Create a sense of inferiority among unsuccessful youths

When certain individuals are deemed successful and others are left under the pressure, then this can create a sense of inferiority

#### (1) Poverty.

#### (2) Broken families

### (3) Social disorganization and disconnection

As the proponent of Social Disorganization Theory says when the Society is disorganized and there is absolutely no bond and connectivity among people, then such a society is prone to Criminality. Individuals who do not share any bond with the society can easily commit crime. However, a strong bond prevent an individual from committing a crime in a society with which that person shares a bond.

### (4) Rapid urbanization

One of the key reason behind juvenile delinquency is urbanization, as when families migrate to cities then children get exposed to new people which can influence their behaviors. Similarly, due to rapid

urbanization the social bond among the people of that society be weaker thus, this can enhance the chances of juvenile delinquency.

(5) Influence of Peer group on juvenile

As Edwin Sutherland highlights in his theory Differential Association

Theory, that an individual learns the of criminality or Criminal behavior through peer groups. So in a society the friend circle of a juvenile can greatly influence the behavior of that juvenile and push him towards Criminality. Therefore, the peer group is a crucial factor in juvenile delinquency.

Rapidly growing population and limitedness of national resources also contributes in juvenile delinquency


## Introduction
