Schumacher stated "Infinite growth is impossible on a finite planet" claiming that every natural resource we have now is limited and unchecked extraction may lead to resource scarcity. This vulnerability is increasing with time and the cost of industrialization is faced by developing countries having little contribution in Carbon emission. Unsustainable industrialization and development has the potential to challenge the survival of future generations. Sustainable development According to Brundtland Commission (1987) is "Development that meets the needs of the present without compromising future generation." Pakistan, being one of the most affected region by climate change - faces immense challenges hindering its

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Sustainable growth. ~~po~~ Large population and inequality strain resources and limit social mobility. Further more climate related disasters significantly impact national crises including health, and food insecurity. Development project faces resistance and disruption by non-state terrorist organization such as Balochistan Liberation Army and Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan. Despite these challenges, Pakistan has the potential to become a growing economy of the world. Vast untapped resources, huge renewable energy potential and technological utilization can pave the way for nation's greatness.

Sustainable development seeks to balance economic progress with environmental protection and social justice. Without compromising on the survival

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of generations to come, state can pursue growth without damaging environment. This concept emerged as a response to unchecked industrialization, ~~and~~ exploitation, inequality and climate change. It encompasses human development, environmental protection; and Sustainable development Goals. As defined by Ban Ki-Moon "Saving the planet, lifting people out of poverty, and advancing growth are one and the same fight," and to manage these challenges, sustainable development is only a viable option.

Pakistan faces immense challenges in the way of sustainable development including population growth, poverty and climate related disasters.

Firstly, rapid population growth is pushing states

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resources and limiting state's ability to response. Unchecked population growth put severe strain on social services, education, and health, leaving much of the population vulnerable to poverty. United Nations ^{estimated} population projection of Pakistan claimed that Pakistan's population can cross ~~310~~ million by 2050. Stressing food and water security further. This unsustainable population hinder development efforts.

Secondly, Poverty and inequality is another the biggest challenge. Pakistan is facing today poverty trap limits the capacity of much of the population to access Education and health services. This poverty trap further exacerbates inequality leaving people vulnerable. According to Pakistan Bureau of statistics, 24% of Pakistanis live below

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poverty line much larger than UN's preferred statistic. Instability of state's effective welfare projects further constrain their social mobility.

Thirdly, Climate related disasters destroy much of the infrastructural projects. Pakistan, despite contributing less than 1% of global emission is among the Top 10 most vulnerable countries to climate change. 2022 flood caused \$30 billion in losses according to world bank report. Much of the livelihood of Northern people of Pakistan is dependent on the infrastructure which is destroyed by floods.

Moreover, energy shortage further curtails industrial output. Pakistan imports much of oil and gas to fuel its energy production, leaving it vulnerable to external shocks and balance of payment crises.

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Much of the part of Pakistan faces energy shortages resulting in industrial closure and business trust deficit. NEPRA report indicates energy shortfalls of 3,000-5,000 Mega Watts during Peak demands causing industrial losses and closure. Lack of industrial output constraints sustainable development and growth Potential.

Furthermore, Gender inequality limits half of the population's potential. Women holds half of the sky and no nation can be able to grow without involving women in fields equal to men. In Pakistan this inequality is quite seen in every field. According to United Nations development report 60% of rural Pakistan's women need male permission to work or education leaving them ~~vulnerable~~ ^{dependent} to on.

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paternalist structure.

Another important aspect to development challenge is water mismanagement. much of river water comes from glaciers and is not managed effectively for agriculture. Furthermore ground water extinction and floods increase food insecurity.

Floods of 2022 submerged

2/3rd of Pakistan's agricultural land. Significant ^{number of} employment is also dependent on agriculture leaving people unprotected from poverty and malnutrition.

Finally, Terrorist activities ~~also~~ threatens development projects especially in regions of Balochistan and Khyberpakhtunkhwa. Attack on 'railway' tracks for the sole purpose of disconnecting Province from Capital ~~is~~ erodes trust of foreign direct investment. Furthermore attacks on Chinese

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Chinese workers further create hurdles in completion of projects like CPEC.

Despite these challenges Pakistan has the potential to become a significant regional player by harnessing opportunities like renewable energy transition, Agricultural Modernization and Human development projects.

To begin with, Investing in renewable energy projects is the single most efficient way of reducing energy insecurity and dependency on non-renewable sources.

Pakistan has vast untapped potential of solar and wind energy. Balochistan and Sindh has the potential of 2.9 m MW of solar energy production. Investing in solar energy is not only effective but much cheaper than traditional energy sources.

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In the second place, modernizing agricultural sector ~~that~~ will reduce food insecurity. Adopting precision farming, mini dams and rain water harvesting will improve water crises.

Furthermore, climate resilient agriculture will ~~also~~ preserve food insecurity. Chinese climate resilient crops are threetime more efficient than traditional crops.

Additionally, leveraging climate funds from donor organizations can reduced domestic pressure ~~and~~ caused by economic loss by floods. Conference of the Parties yearly discuss issues related to climate change and push industrial nations to ~~go~~ donate funds for climate crises caused by their industrialization. Climate Cooperation is only an effective

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way for a developing economy like Pakistan to cater climate loss. Policy Framework including United Nations Convention on Climate Change and Sustainable development goals provide weaker states equal opportunity and opportunity to discuss climate vulnerabilities.

likewise, funding Human development projects can reduce social crises such as poverty, education and health. ~~the~~ country's prosperity defined not by its per-capita income but by its human development index. According to UNHDI reports, Pakistan stands at 168 out of 193 countries. Until its vulnerable population have equal access, states ~~be~~ constantly face challenges despite urban development.

Similarly, encouraging local community participation is equally important. Development

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can only give fruits when it is according to the needs of the people. Citizens are needed to be included in decision making and their needs must be met effectively and efficiently.

~~Beside~~ Harnessing Blue economy is another significant opportunity for Pakistan. Pakistan has 1,000km of coastline with vast marine development opportunities. Key sectors of development includes fisheries, tourism and shipbuilding. Furthermore Gwadar has the ~~potiate~~ potential to attract much of the tourism industry. Investing in eco-friendly projects in Ports like Gwadar and Karachi will benefit the economy exponentially.

Lastly, Sustainable urbanization will be an important step to reduce pollution and improve the standard of

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Living Lahore and Karachi are among the top 10 most polluted cities in the world. This issue can only be reduced through developing ~~and~~ mid-urban cities, green parks and awareness campaign. Doing so, will not only reduce slums and population strain but also diversify opportunities. Population is multiple urban cities.
